Children with Allergies

No Nuts or Sharing Food

We have a number of students with nut allergies, which means that should they touch or eat nuts (even the tiniest amount) they could potentially have an allergic reaction called anaphylaxis. This can be life threatening as anaphylaxis affects breathing, blood pressure and can cause unconsciousness or death. Medication is held at school for these students and safety plans are in place.

Nuts can hide in all sorts of places - muesli bars, biscuits and spreads. Packets of snack foods show on the labels whether they contain nuts and we ask parents/caregivers to be mindful of what is placed in their children's lunchboxes.

Rooms 2, 3 and 6 are also WHOLE EGG FREE - no whole eggs or egg sandwiches due to children with severe egg allergies.

In order to provide a safe environment for these children, we actively discourage children from sharing food at Rotokauri School. We would be grateful if you could discuss the potential dangers around sharing food at school.

Carparking

Car parks are shared spaces and we all have a responsibility to keep ourselves and others safe. The Board of Trustees has the legal authority to manage the school carpark in accordance with the law. People using the car park are required to follow the rules set out by the school.

Unfortunately, we are receiving complaints from parents/families about inappropriate behaviour by some of our school families.

Aggressive and rude behaviour towards staff and other parents will not be tolerated. Please ensure that all members of the family or friends picking up your children understand the rules regarding the car park.

Car parks within the school grounds are primarily for staff carparking – however, sometimes spare parks are available for parking - this is the only time parents can get out of their car to pick up children or if parked outside the school grounds.

The disabled carpark is not for parking convenience but for designated drivers that have their identification displayed.

The bus bay and drive through lane are quick pick up and drop off zone – drivers must remain in their vehicles!!





Parking on yellow lines, inside and outside, the school grounds is not acceptable.



Double parking behind parked vehicles and blocking Rotokauri Road is also not acceptable.

During the holiday period, a yellow box with lines, has been painted within the white median strip. This is for vehicles turning right and should be kept clear at all times by vehicles turning into the school. This will ensure that traffic runs smoothly and there is no congestion at the exit gate.



Please show respect and kindness at all times.

Smoking / Vaping

Smoking and vaping is not permitted at or on the grounds of Rotokauri School, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The school must comply with the Smokefree Environments and Regulated Products Act 1990 and the Amendment Act 2020, which makes all schools smokefree and vape free. A breach of this will result in disciplinary procedures for students and staff and will result in a formal complaint against the person who is smoking or vaping if it is a visitor to the school.

Valuables at School (including cellphones and smartwatches)

Rotokauri School cannot be held responsible for the loss or damage of valuables brought to school. We understand that some families feel the need for their children to have cellphones and/or smart watches as a safety measure on their way to and from school. However, during school times these devices are not necessary and these are some of the potential pitfalls –

- The misuse of cameras and internet connection
- The sharing of inappropriate material
- Outside contact during learning time

Therefore, we require children to hand their cellphones (this includes any device with recording or connection capability e.g. iPods, iPads, cameras and tablets) into the office for safe keeping during the day.

If a smart watch is worn, we ask that it not be used in the same way as a phone and call-making/messaging is disabled whilst at school.

Devices should not be used on the school grounds (this includes the bus bay before and after school).

For whatever reason a student needs to make contact during the day, it should be through the office after a conversation with the child's teacher.

We encourage any other valuables, including items of sentimental value, to be kept at home.

Water Policy

We are a water only school. Please do not place anything else in your children's drink bottles.

It is an expectation that all children participate in the school production, as many hours of practising have taken place. If your child will not be attending please contact the classroom teacher.

On the night (Thursday 3rd August) all students need to be dropped off at the venue by 6.00 p.m. Doors will open for ticket holders at 6.15 p.m.

Parking will be available on the streets around the venue (e.g Duke Street, Higgins Road, Charlie's Way) - there is **no** parking at the venue. We would appreciate families following the directions of the staff and volunteers directing people on the night so that everyone is safe and traffic flows smoothly.

Tickets are on sale at the school office – only 40 tickets remain for the evening production. We **may be** able to provide a matinee if all tickets are sold out.

Tickets are **\$10 per seat**. Students that are performing in the production do not need to purchase tickets.

If you are bringing preschoolers to the performance and have not purchased a ticket for them, then they will need to sit on an adult's knee and we request that they are actively supervised before and during the production.

Medical Requirements

Please ensure that you come to the school office to fill out a medical form if your child requires medication during school hours. If your child needs to use an inhaler please ensure that they are brought to school, named and in a sealed plastic bag. No medications can be administered without written permission. If medication is held at school please take the time to check expiry dates and how much medication is

there during the year so that, if needed, the medication will work correctly when administered.

If your child has an allergy, is asthmatic or has other medical conditions that require a health plan please let the school office know so that these plans can be completed or updated (as per the Ministry of Health regulations).

Team / Group Photographs

Team Photographs will be taken on Thursday, 24 August. We will be using the on-line ordering system so payment details will come home at a later date. Remember to send your child with their sports uniform on the day of the photo and if necessary, to have <u>black</u> leggings or shorts and white socks so that the photographs look tidy with everyone looking like a team.
