I always feel a great swell of pride when students share their success outside of school. Congratulations to Paige Robinson Hastings for her recent success. We are all so proud of you!!!


Paige competed in Rangiora, Christchurch at the Alpine Classic Cheerleading Competition last weekend. She was very nervous but excited, her first time on a plane too.
