Mrs Kirkham is very passionate about learning and has already been in a management role leading the senior school at Te Totara. Mrs Kirkham's skill set will be instrumental in making sure our students, when they leave in Year 8, will make an easy transition into high school.

TRIP TO TECH

We are giving the parents of our Year 5, 6, 7 and 8 students an opportunity to watch the Rotokauri Year 7 and 8's at Tech. Part of our senior educational programme for Year 7 and 8's involves the use of the Hamilton Junior High School Tech Department. These are some of the most modern facilities in New Zealand after receiving a major upgrade. PERFORMING ARTS ASSEMBLY

At the end of last term we had a special performing arts assembly. Students were asked earlier in the term if they wanted to perform in front of the school. We had students perform songs, dances and even a comedy act. The skills and confidence that our students displayed was incredible. PICK UP TIMES FROM SCHOOL

Our morning system is working really well with only a few children turning up before 8.30 am. These students are seated in the bus bay until a bell rings at 8.30 am to allow them to move off to class. It's amazing how quickly they have adjusted to this system. With so many new people at our school we need to remind parents that students need to be picked up before 3.30 pm and that all students are to wait at the front of the school, not on the adventure playgrounds or around the classrooms. If your child needs to remain at school after 3.30 p.m. then an arrangement will need to be made with the After School providers.

Please **DO NOT** ask your child to wait on the playground until you arrive as nobody is there supervising them.

LATENESS AND ABSENTEES

Thank you to all the parents who ring up nice and early in the morning to inform us of their child's absence. Please make sure that you give us the reason for your child's absence so that we can enter this information correctly into our computer system. It is a legal requirement for students to be at school in New Zealand. There is often a correlation between attendance and achievement. Children who have continual time off school fall behind socially and academically. We are very proud of our attendance rate at our school. We have an extremely high rate of attendance on any given day, with a number of our students having full attendance over the first six months of schooling in 2015. If your child has not had a strong attendance rate and reasons are not given as to their absence you will be getting a phone call over the coming weeks. We try and make our school a very positive place where students are actively engaged and actually want to attend. Children need to be on the school grounds prior to the bell that rings at 8.55 a.m. This allows them to get prepared for the day, have social time with their friends, have discussions with the teacher or practice their skills (e.g Maths Whizz). If children arrive late to school they need to report to the office before going to their classrooms. We ask that they enter the classroom with as little disruption as possible, as it can be embarrassing for the child involved and distracting for the other class members.

PERSISTENCE AND EXCELLENCE

Persistence and excellence are two of our five values at Rotokauri School. We talk to the students about these values and last week at assembly we were lucky to have Sarah Fuller at our school. Sarah is a New Zealand archery representative and was very open in communicating what persistence and excellence meant in terms of her life and sport. Our students learned that to succeed you need to be very driven and show persistence, often in adverse conditions. Our students were amazed to find that Sarah holds down a fulltime job and still manages to train 30 hours a week. We were also surprised to find that Sarah has to fund much of her expenses, including bows worth \$3,500 each. Sarah gave us a real insight into what athletes have to do in their chosen sport if they want to qualify for the Rio Olympics.

Thank you Sarah for coming in and explaining in detail what persistence and excellence is all about. We wish Sarah all the best in the Archery World Champs in Copenhagen, which she is currently competing in and we will track her progress with great interest over the coming year. 
