A message to the school community on behalf of the Rotokauri Primary School Management and Board of Trustees.

Folk will be aware of the exciting plans for improvement of the upper school area which is the space bounded by the library, rooms one and two and the multipurpose room. A new cloak bay area and awning for the library and room eight, resurfacing of the grounds with feature painting and additional seating are possible ventures. These changes will make for a more user friendly and safer environment to play and learn.

Plans are yet to be finalised but it has become apparent that several of the options open to us may impact on one familiar feature – the silk tree in front of room one. When replacing the irregular old concrete the potential for the expansion of the roots of this tree pose a risk to any new surface the school invests in. The removal of this tree would not

Asthma Awareness Week

Did you know that 1 in 7 children in New Zealand have Asthma? That's around 22,200 in the Waikato.

Over 550,000 school days are lost each year due to the condition.

Spring is in the air – and so are lots of other things!

Triggers such as pollen may set off your sensitive airways.

- Ensure that you carry your reliever (blue) inhaler on you at all times
 - o This helps relax the muscles around your airways
- If you have a preventer continue to take it morning and night, every day
 - o This helps keep the inside of your airways clear
- If you have a puffer type inhaler use your spacer
 - o 50% more medication will get to your lungs
