Welcome back everyone and a special welcome to our new families who have joined us over the Christmas holiday period. We hope that you and your children enjoy Rotokauri School and the special caring environment that we as a learning community provide. The first few weeks focus on building our school culture, through our school values and beliefs. Some times after a long holiday children need reminding about how we do things at Rotokauri and what is expected of them.

Over the coming weeks students may do various assessments so that we decide on their learning requirements for the year. As a school we always try and support the students so that they can reach their full potential. Every child has different needs, not all children come into school with same set of skills and experiences and that is what makes teaching so exciting. It's about appreciating and respecting the differences.

Our teachers will also be covering Information Technology Safety. The general concepts covered are based around digital citizenship and cyber-safety. Coverage of these topics is obviously based on the age of the children. Numerous community consultations have shown that Information Technology is high on the learning agendas of many parents. It's great to have discussions at home around cyber safety as well as at school.

Teachers have been working hard over the holidays putting together exciting programmes that will bond their class and create positive, caring environments.

Your children may come home and talk about the concept of TEAM. This means - Together Everyone Achieves More. When everyone follows this one belief it's amazing the culture that can be created in a small semi-rural school.

In Term One our teachers will be promoting the values of Respect and Responsibility. Discussions will occur both formally and informally in the class about students respecting themselves, respecting others and respecting the school environment. They will also be

encouraged to be responsible for their own belongings, to be responsible for their own behaviour and to be responsible for their own work.

## DONATIONS

Since 2000 parents in New Zealand have contributed close to 1 billion dollars (20/1/16 Network One News) towards their children's education through school donations. School donations are vital if we want to cover all of our student's educational and social needs.

As a high decile school we are not funded to the same extent as other schools with lower decile rating. Our PTA works tirelessly to help fund various school projects and our Board are very astute about how money should be spent.

Our school donation has not risen in 10 years. The school donation is \$100 per child, with no family paying more than \$250. Some parents prefer to donate per term or on a weekly basis, which is fine.

We appreciate all the donations made and please feel free to contact Sharon if you want to arrange a payment plan.

## PTA

## **POOL HELPERS**

Thank you to all our wonderful helpers who did a tremendous job keeping our pool clean over the summer break. It's no longer a right to have a school pool, as many are closed due to cost of the upkeep and policy implications.

We hope that by having our pool open we are providing a safe option for children to swim in, rather than risking the use of the local lake or river.

## **SWIMMING**

It's vital that you make sure that your child brings their togs to school on a daily basis so that they can participate in swimming. Even learning to float or not panic when hitting the water may save your child's life.

We have the highest drowning rate in the world and a country that is surrounded by water should make sure all its citizens can swim.

Our pool will be open until Easter. For our new parents you may be unaware that our pool is heated, so even though outside temperatures may fall in March our pool can remain at 24°C.

If your child is not swimming a note to the teacher is required. The school expectation is that all children will participate in swimming lessons unless they are sick.

How's your New Year's resolution going? You may be in the 99% majority who have already faltered since New Year.

How about having a chat with your child and setting a goal together for their 2016 year. Goals need to have substance – be manageable, be trackable and be celebrated at the end.

## **RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION**


Our community has signalled through last year's community consulting that they still would like Religious Instruction for our students.

These lessons will take place from 23<sup>rd</sup> February. The lessons only last for 30 minutes per week and are based around values.

If you do not want your child to attend please supply a note before the 23<sup>rd</sup> February. A child saying they are not attending is not sufficient.

## CARPARK SAFETY

Each year we remind our parents about car park safety. The Board have maintained and improved the carpark over the years, however this does not alleviate all of the problems. It's the parents that make the carpark safe for our children. Please view the diagram below and if you are getting a friend or grandparent to pick up your child please make sure they are aware of the rules.



## ATTENDANCE

It's imperative that you contact the office if your child is going to be away from school. If we believe the child is supposed to be at school and doesn't arrive it then becomes a safety issue and time and energy is spent tracking down the whereabouts of the child. Please feel free to call the school from 7.45 am onwards. Just give us the child's name, the classroom and the reason why the child is away. That way we can enter the information into our computer system.

In Term 4 of 2015, we had an average of 94% attendance by our students.

There is a close correlation between attendance rates and achievement of students.

Makes sense really doesn't it, how can they learn if they are not here?

## BEING ON TIME

Children that are late often find that they have missed vital instructions. They also miss the socialisation of meeting and greeting their mates.

A bell rings at 8.58 a.m. and this is the time when students need to prepare for the days learning. For some classes this means sitting on the mat, for others it means sitting at their table ready.

When parents hear the 2 minute bell can they please leave the classroom. This is all part of being responsible and independent.

## HEALTH AND SAFETY

We have a number of our students who have personal health and safety plans in our school.

If a new child to our school has health issues this requires a note from the doctor supporting the requirement for a plan.

Some students have medications held and administered at school. Please check any medicines (i.e. asthma inhalers, tablets etc) for their expiry date and hand in to Sharon packaged safely, with clear instructions for administration.

**You are also required to sign a form giving the school permission to administer medication on your behalf. No medication will be administered at school unless this form is filled in.**

### School immunisations 2016

Dear Parents / Caregivers,

Public health nurses will be delivering two school-based immunisation programmes at your school this year.

#### Year seven students

These students will be offered the Boostrix vaccine which is a booster for their early childhood immunisations of tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (whooping cough).

Information about the year seven programme will be given to students at school and this session may include watching the Ministry of Health DVD *Year Seven Immunisations*.

This DVD presentation is designed specifically for this age group.

At this information session, your child will be given a consent form to bring home for you to read and choose whether or not to have your child immunised by the public health nurses at school. Whether you choose to immunise or not, the form needs to be returned to school.

- **Please check with your doctor or practice nurse if you are unsure if your child has had a tetanus injection in the last two years.**

#### Year eight female students

These students will be offered the HPV (Human Papillomavirus) vaccine, which is available to girls and young women aged 12-18 years. The vaccine helps protect women against infection from four types of human papillomavirus that can lead to most cervical cancers and genital warts. Three doses of the vaccine are given over six months at school, commencing in March. It is offered to year 8 girls as it is recommended to be given long before girls become sexually active, and some studies have shown a more effective immune response in girls aged 9-15 years, when compared with girls over 16.

Information will be given to the students about the HPV vaccination programme at school. This may include viewing the Ministry of Health DVD *HPV Vaccine Information – a vaccine to help prevent cervical cancer*. This DVD presentation is designed specifically for this age group.


Your child will be given a consent form to bring home for you to choose whether or not to have your child immunised by the public health nurses at school.

- Information on the immunisations is included on the consent form which will be given to your son / daughter at the information session.
- Please complete the consent form and answer all the questions and return the form to school.
- If your child is not being vaccinated at school you still need to fill in the section with your child's name and details on it.

Nicky and Harold (Waipa King Country Life Education) will be visiting  
Rotokauri School from Friday 12<sup>th</sup> – Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> February 2016.



Year 7/8 Students and Teachers will be participating in the substance  
strand, *From the Shadows*.

This module focuses on drug use and the impact of various substances on individuals,  
friends and families. A DVD titled 'Web of Addiction' is used, telling real life stories, from  
New Zealander's about their experiences in the drug world. A major part of this module  
relates to the effects of drugs on the teenage brain. Discussion and teaching are outlined  
as follows:

- Puberty and the teenage brain.
- Consequences of early and prolonged drug use, and how addiction affects the human body.
- Understanding how substances interfere, and change the way the brain functions
- The difference between Adult use and Teenage use of Alcohol (metabolically)
- Consideration of the social effects, drugs and alcohol have during adolescence.
- Decision making and Peer Pressure

The key messages during this module are:

- Drug use has an impact on the user themselves and other people around them
- We need to be kind to others particularly as we cope with our changing bodies and feelings.
- We are better able to make decisions for ourselves when we have reliable information and consequences of our decisions both positive and negative

We also suggest throughout this module, that should the occasion arrive to 'delay your decision'.


