PRINCIPAL'S PIECE

It is great to hear about the number of students that are playing winter sports this term – football, rugby, netball, hockey and rollerblading. Kiwi children play sport to have fun, play with their friends, learn new skills, be fit and healthy and to have a sense of fair play. Later I have included a Code of Conduct to help parents support their child.

Last week the Senior Syndicate held their Parent Interviews – thank you to all the families that were able to attend. The Junior Syndicate teachers will continue to report on their students as part of the reporting schedule (Progress or Anniversary) based on the students time at school. Regular two-way communication between home and school is an essential part of the learning process. At Rotokauri School we report on individual progress to inform parents and promote better learning in the future. The reports talk about your child's progress and achievement, including against the National Standards. To determine where each child is at, teachers will make an overall teacher judgement (OTJ) using a range of assessments, including what they have seen in the classroom, talking about learning with the students, children's assessment of their own and each other's work and results from testing. It is important to remember that students start at different points and progress in their learning in different ways and at different rates from one another. Parents are welcome to contact their child's classroom teacher at any time during the school year should they have any concerns about their child.

Staff Appointment

On behalf of the BOT Appointments Committee I would like to announce that we have appointed Ms Andrea Hall to the position of Assistant Principal. Ms Hall is currently employed at Koromatua School and will begin teaching in Room 3 at the beginning of Term 3. I am certain that everyone will make her feel welcome at Rotokauri School.

Parent Code of Conduct

After consulting with Project Energise I would like to provide parents/caregivers with a Code of Conduct as they support their child/children in the coming months –

- Remember that children play for FUN.
- Applaud effort and good play as well as success.
- Always respect the match officials' decisions.
- Remain outside the field of play.
- Let the coach do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do.
- Encourage the players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials.
- Avoid criticising a player for making a mistake mistakes are a part of learning.
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour.

GENERAL MATTERS

Writing Course - Improving Boys' Literacy Skills - Joseph Driessen

Last term five teachers from Rotokauri School attended an intensive day workshop about raising the standard of literacy for boys. The staff are currently trialling new techniques and/or approaches in their classrooms. Below is some information that they found interesting:

- Boys need to feel pride in their bookwork use a criteria to make bookwork presentable. The criteria should come with a rewards system.
- Use humour let students write stories and use language that they find funny.
- Regular movement helps boys keep focussed on their tasks move around every 20 - 30 minutes.
- Expect high standards and accept nothing less.
- Remind students that they are at school to work hard.
- Boys need to be taught self-management and time management.
- Expectations need to be spelt out. Boys need firm boundaries if they overstep these, then there needs to be a consequence.
- Teach the correct formation of letters and expect it to be used. It takes the hard work out of writing if formation is automatic.
- Some boys need to talk through their ideas before they are sure they understand what they have read and before they can commit their ideas to paper effectively.
- Boys will be deeply engaged in literacy when the themes touch them personally tap into their need for tasks to be purposeful and meaningful to their lives.

Cross Country

Due to the poor weather conditions the school cross country which was to be held on Thursday 18th May was postponed. The back-up day is today, Thursday 25th May. If your child finished 1st, 2nd or 3rd in their race, they will qualify to attend the Inter School Cross Country on Friday, 2nd June at Waitetuna School. They will receive a notice with the details.

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
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
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




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
