GENERAL MATTERS

Classroom Release Time

In New Zealand schools teachers are entitled to Classroom Release Time (CRT) to enable teachers to undertake duties related to their teaching role. CRT is used –

- To enhance the school's teaching and learning programmes.
- For teachers' professional growth.
- For addressing the needs of the students.

Each school has a policy on the use of CRT which outlines what the CRT is to be used for. This may include student assessment, administrative tasks, meeting with parents, leadership team or outside agencies. Teachers are allocated two days per term for CRT.

Additional release time is also provided to staff to enable them to fulfil other responsibilities they may hold in the school e.g. our Deputy Principal and Assistant Principal receive a Management day which is taken each Monday.

Teacher Aides in the Classroom

The main role of a teacher's aide is to be an aide to the teacher (not a 'helper' for individual students). Teachers' aides work, with guidance from the classroom teacher, to support the classroom teaching programme and student learning. Teacher Aide time is supplied to a classroom teacher when -

- A student comes to school with funding (or qualifies for funding) to have specific assistance for programmes such as Speech and Language, transition support to the classroom from Early Childhood Centres.
- A student has an RTLB allocated to them for Learning or Behaviour services which requires on-going additional support.
- Support is needed in order to put in place a Behaviour Plan.
- A student or group of students is part of the School Target group or requires additional help because they are below the National Standard. (This allocation of support is given at the discretion of School Management and SENCO and is based on student need)

Teachers use Teacher Aides in a variety of ways to support the learning in their classrooms based on student centred learning goals.
