Women's Refuge

Well done to these two young ladies for making a difference in the community - Hi, our names are Natal Birks (Rm 6) and Lilly Aitchison (Rm 7), and we need your help! ©

We are learning about caring for others in our community in Church at the moment, and we've decided we want to be a part of helping a very important charity that is life changing for hundreds of women and children every minute of every day. Women's Refuge provide **safety**, **care** and **education** to women and children who live in homes that are unsafe and life threatening. They rely largely on donations from individuals and companies and we want to help them. **Will you help us?** When women leave the care of Women's Refuge they often don't have any personal belongings, they are given small care packages to help them get started and this is what we are collecting for.

We are collecting things like: **Toothpaste**, **Toothbrushes**, **Face Cloths**, **Soap**, **Body wash**, **Shampoo**, **Conditioner**, **Sanitary products**, **Deodorant**, **Hand/Face cream**. These are simple everyday items, things that we might take for granted, that vulnerable women and children just don't have because of the violent or dangerous circumstances they are escaping.

If you would like to help us with this collection, and are able to donate even just one item you will be a part of something much larger than that one item, you will be a part of a community that cares for its vulnerable members, and that is a huge thing! There will be a basket at the office from Monday morning till end of school Friday.

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
