GENERAL MATTERS

Student Led Conferences

Many schools in New Zealand are using student led conferences to report to and share information with parents and caregivers. Student led conferences are a conversation between the student, their parents and their teacher. It gives students the opportunity to share their growth as a learner. Students are accountable and responsible for their progress and achievement, and demonstrate a growing understanding of their development as independent learners.

Student led conferences are designed to achieve some of these goals -

- to help students demonstrate evidence of learning
- to teach students the process of reflection and self-evaluation of their learning goals (goals set by themselves, their parent/s or by the teacher).
- to encourage student's oral communication skills and to increase their selfconfidence
- to encourage students, parents and teachers to engage in open and honest discussions about learning
- to encourage students to accept personal responsibility for their learning
- to increase parent understanding of their child's learning

Both research and experiences by other schools have demonstrated that student-led conferences offer many benefits including the following:

stronger sense of accountability among students;

- stronger sense of pride in achievement among students;
- more productive student-teacher relationships;
- · development of leadership skills among students;
- stronger links between home and school.

Headlice

This appears to be an ongoing issue for most schools. If you discover that your child/children have headlice it is a school expectation that they will be treated prior to returning to school. It is also important that other members of the family are treated. Our school's Public Health Nurse has provided tips for treating headlice. If you would like to use this information please see Sharon in the office for a copy of the paperwork.

Road Patrol

We work hard to keep our children safe, so we provide road patrollers and we encourage our students to use the pedestrian crossings daily. If you are walking your child/children to and from the carparks, please lead by example. It is also disappointing having to correct children's behaviour such as exiting and entering vehicles as this is a driver's responsibility.

School Hats - Terms 4 and 1

For Terms 4 and 1 all students need to wear a Rotokauri sunhat, which is available from the school office - \$15.00 each. These hats are not to be individualized (no graffiti or accessories added) by the students. Failure to have a hat means the child has to sit in a shaded area during break times.

Hearing and Vision

We are being visited by our Hearing and Vision Technician on Tuesday, 12 September. Not all children will be tested. If you <u>do not</u> want your child tested, please contact the school office. If you have concerns about your child and would like them tested please also contact the school office. Please read the following information sheet.



Information Sheet on Vision and Hearing Checks in School

Vision Hearing Technicians from Community and Southern Rural Health will be visiting our school.

The objective of the test is to identify previously undetected vision and hearing defects.

Which children are routinely checked?

- Catch up screening for children who have not completed vision and hearing checks as part of their B4 School Check
- Children absent from previous visit, require retests or follow up
- In special circumstances, parents, teachers or others may request a vision or hearing check
- New immigrants

What tests are carried out?

Ears

- Audiometry (hearing test)
- Tympanometry middle ear function test (only carried out when hearing test is not within a normal range)

Eves

Long distance vision tests – not a complete visual examination, but a simple screening test *NB All of these checks are non-invasive, safe and should cause no discomfort.*

The Vision Hearing Technician will:

- Notify parents of all test results
- Enter results on Ministry of Education database (Enrol)

The Vision Hearing Technician will obtain personal details from the school ie; names, date of birth.

If the technician needs to contact parents or caregivers following the visit, addresses and phone numbers will also be required.

Our Service may share this information with other health professionals involved in the children's care

If any parents/caregivers **do not** want their child to be checked, or their child is currently under specialist care for a vision or hearing defect, they should let the school know.

- 3 Tbsp. honey
- 3 Tbsp. peanut butter
- 1 cup natural nuts loosely chopped
- 1 ½ cup rolled oats

Whizz up dates in a food processor and then add to oats and nuts in a separate bowl.

Melt honey and peanut butter in a pot or microwave then add to

the oat mixture. Stir through to mix all ingredients.

Transfer to a dish lined with plastic wrap or baking paper. Press down until flat then refrigerate until firm. Remove and chop into bars.
