

Zone Change

An amendment to our school enrolment scheme home zone has been approved by the Ministry of Education. The amendment will take effect from 1st January 2018. Below is the home zone description –

Description of the boundary of Rotokauri School Enrolment Scheme Home Zone

Starting at the intersection of Exelby Road and Te Kowhai Road, head east to the intersection of Burbush Road and Te Kowhai Road. Te Kowhai road is not in zone. All of Exelby and Burbush Roads are in zone.

From the intersection of Burbush Road and Te Kowhai Road, head east to State Highway 1/Mangaharakeke Drive and follow it south to Te Wetini Drive. Head south west along Te Wetini Drive to the round-about then continue to number 256 Rotokauri Road. Rotokauri Road from number 256 is in zone. Kawariki Drive, Rengarenga Close and Patatee Terrace are not in zone.

Follow Rotokauri Road around to the intersection with Brymer Road, then head south along Brymer Road to Bagust Road. Brymer Road from number 156 inclusive, is in zone. Bayerstock Road is not in zone.

Follow Bagust Road back to Rotokauri Road. All of Bagust Road, O'Brien Road, Hillview Road and Hockly Road are in zone. Follow Rotokauri Road into Laxon Road and turn into Lindsay Road. All of Lindsay Road is in zone.

From the intersection of Lindsay Road and Cemetery Road, head north to the intersection of Laxon Road and Perkins Road. Cemetery Road and Perkins Road are not in zone. Laxon Road north of the intersection with Perkins Road is in zone (from number 84).

From the intersection of Laxon Road and Perkins Road, head north east to number 194A Duck Road, just south of the intersection of Duck Road and Fullerton Road. From here continue north to the starting point at Exelby Road and Te Kowhai Road. Duck Road starting at number 194A is in zone. Fullerton Road is not in zone.

Both sides of the in-zone roads above are included unless otherwise stated.

Ballot

The Board of Trustees were able to assess that there were 17 Year 1 places available to students who live outside our home zone for 2018. A ballot has been held and the positions have been filled. Congratulations to the applicants that were successful in this process. We look forward to welcoming these children and families to Rotokauri School.

17th November Deadline

As mentioned a number of times in previous newsletters and emails the staff and Board of Trustees are planning for 2018. In order to move forward with the appropriate information we would appreciate the following feedback from families by the 17th November –

- 1. If you have a preference for the class placement of your child for 2018 please send an email to dsmith@rotokauri.school.nz or write a letter and hand into the school office before 17th November. Your email or letter would need to explain your reasons and these will be considered as part of our placement procedure.
- 2. If your child is leaving Rotokauri School at the end of the year we would appreciate being notified by the 17th November, as this information will impact on the class numbers/year levels for 2018.

Car Parking

Poor decision making and modelling of inappropriate car park behaviours has been an ongoing issue for the school this year. The road patrollers have observed parents/caregivers/family members – talking on their mobile phones whilst driving into the carpark to pick up children, driving with no seatbelts on themselves or younger passengers, driving in the wrong direction, backing out of the driveway into oncoming traffic, calling students across the carpark, walking across the carpark themselves when escorting students, allowing students to enter the car from the incorrect side of the vehicle and many more incidents that potentially put our children's safety at risk. Please ensure that all drivers picking up or dropping off our Rotokauri School students know the rules of the car park as well as the road rules for driving on New Zealand roads. We will be recording incidents that are observed as inappropriate and action will be taken.


Class Sharing Space
