# PRINCIPAL'S PIECE

As I write this newsletter I can hear squeals of delight as children take full advantage of the sunshine and the swimming pool being open for the season. Thank you to Hans Verberne for all the work he has undertaken to get the pool operational.

With the thunderstorms and lightning strikes at a local school this week it is timely to talk about children's safety in situations such as these. Classroom teachers have been speaking to the children about actions that need to be taken when indoors and outdoors during a thunderstorm. Here are some recommendations from the Civil Defence.

#### During a thunderstorm or if a thunderstorm is imminent

GO INSIDE! If you hear distant thunder or see a flash of light, get indoors immediately. A sturdy building is the safest place to be during a severe thunderstorm. Avoid gazebos, rain or picnic shelters, golf carts, and other isolated structures in otherwise open areas because such places are often struck by lightning. In addition, gazebos and picnic shelters are often poorly anchored and subject to being uprooted and blown around in strong thunderstorm winds. They also offer little protection from large hail. Remember, lightning is attracted to metal and poles or rods.

The countdown to the Christmas holidays has begun and it is an extremely busy time for everyone at school. The teachers have completed end of year assessments, reports have been written for all the students, fixed term staff for 2019 have been appointed and two permanent positions are now being advertised, class lists have been confirmed, along with stationery lists, singing and prizegiving practices are underway and classes are enjoying the last few weeks of school together. It is interesting listening to the Year 8 students as they reminisce about their schooling at Rotokauri, for many of them since they were 5 year olds, and dealing with a variety of feelings as they prepare themselves for the next phase in their educational journey. #### **Swimming Pool Key Holders**

Reminder about the swimming pool rules that need to be followed:

#### The key holder shall -

- Be 18 years of age or over.
- Be responsible for the security of the key and shall not transfer the key to any other person (the key must not be lent to or shared with other persons).
- Agree to their name being published on a list of key holders displayed in the pool area.
- Only use the pool facility during the following hours Term time – Monday to Friday 3.00 – 9.00 p.m Weekends, school holidays and public holidays – 10.00 a.m – 9.00 p.m
- Be responsible for ensuring the pool facility is securely locked after entering and upon leaving the pool facility.
- Ensure that only family members and guests of the key holder who the key holder is willing and able to accept full responsibility for, are given access to the pool facility by the key holder.
- Ensure that a mobile phone is carried and is available to use in case an emergency arises whilst using the pool.
- Be responsible for ensuring that every person given access to the pool facility by the key holder complies with the conditions of this agreement.
- Ensure that:
  - Children under 8 years of age must be actively supervised by a responsible caregiver aged 18 years or over (actively supervised means watching your child/children at all times and able to provide immediate assistance).
  - Children between 8 and 18 years of age are actively supervised by a responsible caregiver aged 18 years of age or over.
- Ensure that:
  - There is no running, pushing, bombing, diving or any similar activity, and other displayed rules for safety are followed.
  - Only proper swimming attire is worn, no jeans to be worn in the pool.
  - Appropriate language and behaviour is shown at all times, this includes no smoking or consumption of alcohol in the pool facility.
- Advise (in confidence) the school Principal of any inappropriate behaviour.

- Return the key to the school office on request. If the Principal or Board of Trustees advise that the key holder has breached the conditions of this agreement, no refund will be paid in this event, and the decision will be final.
- Pay the amount of \$85 for the lease of the key for the period 1<sup>st</sup> December 2018

   1 April 2019. A \$10 bond will be refunded on the successful return of the pool key. If keys are lost a replacement fee will be charged.
