#### **Ballot**

At the August BOT meeting we discussed and approved the running of a ballot for the 2021 year at Rotokauri School.

Enrolment at Rotokauri School is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office. The criteria that the ballot follows are listed below:

- Priority One not applicable at Rotokauri School
- Priority Two sibling of a current student at Rotokauri School
- Priority Three sibling of a former student at Rotokauri School
- Priority Four child of a former student at Rotokauri School
- Priority Five child of an employee of the Board of the school or a child of a member of the Board of the school.
- Priority Six all other applicants.


Evidence will need to be provided to the school (e.g. school report, school photo) for Priority 2-5.
