

It's that time of year again. The drive was such a huge success last year, with the generous donations we managed to make up a years supply of care bags for the families of Rainbow Place. Because of its success and because there is a need for services like this, we have been working hard this year to become a registered charity. As mentioned last year Kaeleb (Room 5) and Madison's (Room 2) cousin passed away in 2016, he was only 5 years old. His mother and I started this charity in memory of him to help support other families going through what they did, and how fitting it was, on the week of the anniversary of his death, we received our registration acceptance. We are still working alongside Rainbow Place to supply care bags and other needs for their families, however now that we are officially a separate entity we also hope to expand that in the future and work with other similar organisations.





