Kia Ora Parents and Whānau

Three short weeks ahead as we quickly move towards our first set of holidays. This year our Easter break is not in the school holidays and therefore we have a five day break (Good Friday 2nd April – Tuesday 6th April) which means that staff and students come back to school on **Wednesday**, **7**th **April**. The last day of term for students is Thursday, 15th April, as Friday is a Teacher Only Day. Class and individual/family photos are also on Thursday, 15th April.

Attendance

For the Ministry of Education the key measure of attendance is the proportion of students who attend school regularly, that is, the percentage of students who have attended more than 90% of half-days (this is an increase from past years). At Rotokauri School we have 199 students enrolled currently. Overall, we have a 94% attendance rate for Term 1 at the present time. This is tremendous and we thank you for ensuring students are at school daily. However, of concern, are the 30 students that are under the 90% attendance expectation of the Ministry of Education. If you are worried that your child might be one of these statistics please let me know and we can discuss ways of assisting families to maintain a high attendance rate. We know that some children have experienced a great deal of sickness but we also have children that have unexplained or unjustified absences.

I hope that you all have an enjoyable and safe Easter break, a time to relax, refresh and spend time with family and friends.

BOT NEWS

An email was sent home earlier this week about information discussed at our recent BOT meeting – this is just an extra reminder.

Court Orders

Parents are responsible for providing the school with any court orders affecting a parent's right of access to records or contact with their children. Parents are encouraged to notify the school of any change in circumstances at home and of any court orders, so that the school is aware of who has the right to have the child in their care at any particular time.

Please ensure that the school is fully aware of any arrangements if they exist for any child enrolled at Rotokauri School.

Car Parking

Every family is aware of the many issues that the school experiences with the picking up of students in the afternoon. The Ministry of Education is also well aware of our concerns. However, the responsibility is on parents, caregivers and whanau to follow the road wardens, staff and New Zealand road rules to ensure that our carpark works safely, efficiently and effectively, whilst always having our children's needs at the forefront.

It is not appropriate (or legal) to stop on the median strip outside the school, leave your car and go to find your child.

Last month the BOT asked the staff to start trialling some solutions to easing congestion at the school gate. The school bell has been ringing at 2.55 p.m. for staff to move their students to the bus bay ready for a 3.00 p.m. pickup. There is no change to the 3.00 p.m. school finish time so parents do not need to arrive at 2.55 p.m.

The BOT would like to encourage parents to -

- Park in both the front and rear carpark at the top of the school, the staff will direct you to an available parking space.
- If families have only senior students please pickup from the bottom gate which comes off Rotokauri Road as this will help with the traffic congestion which we are experiencing between 3.00 3.15 p.m.
- If you are parking in the bus bay, drivers are to remain in their vehicles and children are to <u>only</u> enter the vehicle from the footpath side of the vehicle.

THE HAPPY DOGS




