

Reminders

- Please ensure all clothing is named so we can return them to their owners.
- Rotokauri School sunhats stay at home during Term 2 & 3.
- Children riding to school must be 10 years old. If you wish your younger children
 to ride to school then a letter giving permission must be sent to the Principal. All
 students riding to school must wear an approved helmet. It is a parent's
 responsibility to ensure that their children know the road rules and show them the
 safest way to get to school. We have had a number of close calls due to children
 weaving on the road and/or crossing the road in unsafe places.
- It is also a parent's responsibility to ensure that any children walking to school know the road rules and they have been shown the safest way to get to school. Children need to know where to walk when there is no footpath and how/when to cross the road.
- Drop off/Pick up zone (in the busbay) please be aware that this is not a space for parents to get out of the car to help students get in or out of cars. If you are using this area then you are expecting your child/children to get out/in by themselves. If you are using this area then your child/children are ready and waiting to get into your car. In other circumstances we request that you find a carpark in or outside the school grounds.
- Thank you to the parents that have been using the bottom gate for picking up their children. Usually we would have closed this gate permanently for the term, however for as long as possible we will be leaving this gate open as an option for picking up students.

This week we farewelled Melissa from Atmosphere as she has taken one year's maternity leave. We all wish her and her husband the best of luck for their new arrival this month.

The Keeping Ourselves Safe programme will be taught in all the classrooms (Rooms 1-8). The parents' role in this programme is to support their child with the home-based activities that are included in the Keeping Ourselves Safe programme.

What students will learn?

Years 1 – 3 resources will help students to learn:

- A range of safety skills that they can use when interacting with others.
- What they can do if they have been or are being abused.

Years 4 – 8 resources will help students to learn:

- A range of safe practices that they can use when interacting with others.
- What they can do if they have been or are being abused.
- What happens when abuse if reported.

BOT NEWS

During the holidays the BOT arranged for some building maintenance work to be completed in the staffroom and on the steps to a number of classrooms.

During the holidays I have analysed our Term 1 attendance data and this will be presented to the BOT at our May meeting.

- 32 students = 100% attendance for Term 1
- The Ministry of Education has an expectation that students attend school for 90% or more at Rotokauri School we have only 13% of our students under this rate, for a variety of reasons. So well done and keep it up.

STUDENT COUNCIL NEWS

- The Student Council successfully ran and judged the Easter themed colouring competition at the end of Term 1.
- The Student Council have organised Rotokauri School beanies, which can be worn outside the classroom during Terms 2 and 3. The beanies are black and have the Rotokauri School logo on the front. Saturday Morning Music Classes

Enrolments are now open for Term Two 2021 at the Waikato Community School of Music. The first session is on <u>Saturday 8th May</u>. The school caters for all ages (3 to retired) and ability levels, offering group-format and one-to-one music tuition in a range of instruments. Group-format class fees range from \$39 to \$105 per term (on average 8 lessons) depending on student age and instrument. The enrolment fee for an instrument class includes participation in as many of our ensembles as the student wishes. One-to-one classes can aid in preparing for exams and earning NCEA credits.
