### PRINCIPAL'S PIECE

#### Kia Ora Parents and Whānau

I hope that you are all adjusting to the change in temperature – we have noticed how wind and rain has an impact on the student's behaviour and people's moods. This week I have had the privilege of visiting a number of classrooms to observe maths lessons with the facilitator who is working with our teachers. I was really impressed with the student's enthusiasm for learning maths, the great thinking that was occurring, the engagement that was happening and the articulate way in which the children talked about their maths. I would recommend that you ask your children what they are learning on a regular basis and get them to show you. Things have certainly changed since I went to primary school and possibly you will find the same.

Congratulations to the two Lit Quiz teams that competed at Southwell last week. What a great experience. Also, thank you to the parents for supporting their children and to Sarah Dyer for managing the teams. Reading certainly does open many doors. Talking

about reading – can I please remind families that they need to be encouraging all students to read on a daily basis, complete their reading logs and returning these to school. It is so great to see in some classrooms that students have reached and surpassed the goal of 100 nights of reading – tremendous work to those students.

<u>SeeSaw</u> is one of the platforms that we use to share student's learning. It is used across the school and fosters meaningful and positive engagement between home and school, centred on your child's learning. Here are some pointers for making the most of SeeSaw -

- 1. Check Seesaw regularly. You'll get notifications about new entries in your child's journal and can respond to their work. Customise your notification preferences in Account Settings.
- 2. Celebrate your child's classroom success. Help to encourage the skills your child is working on in class outside of school.
- 3. Specific comments are best. Asking questions, or complementing specific details can add to the learning conversation.
- 4. In a group or 'everyone' post your comment is visible to everyone tagged the students and their parents. This is a great opportunity to lift up the whole class!

Seesaw looks different across year levels and even between classes. If you are not connected to your child's SeeSaw learning journal either by the phone app or on your computer please talk to the classroom teacher and they will assist you with getting connected.

There is a school expectation that students are sharing 2 pieces of work per term in the curriculum areas of Reading, Writing and Maths – keep an eye out for these.

#### **Donations**

Thank you to those families who have already paid their school donations. We are now reminding families that their contributions would be gratefully accepted.

We could explain to you the inequities of the government funding. There is no doubt that the discrepancies between actual funding and actual spending are getting wider. The government reviews have found that high decile schools are underfunded. Rotokauri School is a decile 8 school. The reality is that we get much less funding than a decile 1 school of the same size. We have not increased the school donation for a number of years.

It is the little things that matter; matter to your child; matter to us as professionals and matter to our community. We want to provide your child/ren with maximum educational opportunities. We rely on your parent donations to support meeting our learner's needs. Many extra activities are funded by the Rotokauri School Board of Trustees – your school donation goes towards enhancing the learning at Rotokauri School. We also have an amazing PTA that provide support for many extras for the school e.g. visiting performers, learning resources etc. The fundraising that the PTA and parents provide is separate to the parent donation. We give in advance a heartfelt thanks to you for supporting your school. All donations are tax deductible.
