#### Safety in our School Carpark

Please listen to and follow directions given by school staff whilst in the school carpark. If there are spare parking spaces the staff will direct you to these. It is imperative that you remain in your vehicle when parked in the bus bay. Your child/children should enter the car from the kerb, not walk around the back of the car to get in. Also, the disability carpark located closest to the school office is only to be used by vehicles displaying the appropriate mobility card.

The Police would like to inform the school community that they will be doing random checks of driver's behaviour and ticketing over the coming months.

## **Ballot and Enrolment 2023**

The Board of Trustees invites applications from parents/caregivers who wish to enrol their sons and daughters at Rotokauri School for 2023.

Enrolment at Rotokauri School is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

An application form must be completed for all students wishing to enrol at Rotokauri School. In and out-of-zone application forms are available from the school office (office@rotokauri.school.nz).

The deadline for receipt of applications for out-of-zone places is **Friday 14<sup>th</sup> October 2022**.

Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.

The Board has determined that up to **40 places** are likely to be available for out-of-zone students next year in Year 1. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required it will be held on **Friday 21<sup>st</sup> October 2022**. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

#### Ruben the Road Safety Bear

Room 1, 2, 3 and 4 had a visit from Ruben the Road Safety Bear this week. He helped children to remember road safety rules such as Stop, Look, Listen and Link to cross a pedestrian crossing and to click on a helmet for bike riding and a seatbelt in the car. Children are safer when they stay in a booster seat until they are 148cm tall. Also a reminder about sneaky driveways- driveways that are long, difficult to see past and where cars reverse out. Ruben was most impressed with our junior children's behaviour and how much they had retained about how to stay safe. Children have been given a Ruben pencil and workbook.
