Retirement – Win Schmits & Hans Verberne

It is with sadness that we announce the retirement of Mrs Win Schmits, a well-respected reliever at Rotokauri School for the last 11 years. She is retiring after 40 plus years of teaching. She has taught in both private and public schools at all levels from New Entrants to tertiary level. Professional highlights of her career have included participating in the development of a handbook to support teachers of hearing-impaired students, being a member of a team to input into the New Zealand National Technology Curriculum and as a facilitator in Gifted and Talented Education. A secondment to the Waikato University School of Education involved tutoring and providing workshops in Mathematics, Literacy and Professional Studies for teachers and teacher trainees. Part of her role was to visit teacher trainees on their practicums to observe, assess, support and advise. Another career highlight was Win's selection as one of five teachers for an international OECD research paper about teachers of highly effective teaching practice. Win has also been a team leader and an Assistant Principal.

Win has always brought her love of music (and her music qualifications) into schools. This has included being a specialist music teacher and directing school productions with singing, dancing and acting. An avid supporter of outdoor education Win has been involved in, and responsible for, school camps (at times for 120 students and parents) for over 30 years. She has also coached netball and has shared her experiences as a representative basketball player with a national referee qualification to coach students. Win has always included visual art experiences into her teaching. She was a 'bubble school' teacher during two lockdowns at Rotokauri School, and took great pleasure in noting how relaxed and absorbed the students were when working on their art creations.

Win has a thousand reasons for being involved in education and has identified a few. She loved being part of a genuine teaching team, especially at Rotokauri School, which

has a strong commitment to children's learning and the desire to make a positive difference. She believes that education is a key that unlocks endless opportunities and choices in a multitude of academic and life experiences, and has always felt the magic and fun of working alongside students of all ages.

For Win, the true magic of teaching happens when a student says 'I get it and I can do this by myself'.

We thank Win for the huge contribution that she has made to Rotokauri School over the last 11 years and for all the wisdom and expertise that she has shared with students and staff. You will be missed Win.

At the end of this term we will say goodbye to Mr Hans Verberne, our wonderful caretaker. Mr Hans will be retiring after many years working at Rotokauri School. We thank Hans for the huge contribution that he has made to Rotokauri School and always going above and beyond to keep our school 'ticking along'. You will be missed Hans.


Room 2 have been working hard to include 'magic adjectives' to describe. Here is some descriptive writing about snails from our Year 1 and 2 students.
