Attendance and Absence Notification

There are many justified reasons why a student may be kept at home for the day and we ask that parents contact us by telephone, email, in person or via the school app; ideally before 9.00 a.m. so that the absence can be appropriately recorded. When notifying the school please let us know your child's name, the class they are in and the reason for their absence.

Any unexplained absences on the teachers' roll after 9.10 a.m. will be followed up by a telephone call to the parents/caregivers. If the school is not notified of the absence and a reason, the child will be marked as Truant.

Absences are monitored by staff, as this is a requirement of the Ministry of Education.

Student Leave

If a student needs to take leave for any purpose and for any length of time please contact the Principal. A Student Leave form will need to be completed and signed prior to the student taking leave.

Staff Hours of Contact

Please note that our staff are available in their class from 8.30 a.m. Due to privacy this may not be the best time to raise a concern in front of other families (or your child) so it may be appropriate to email your concerns to the teacher and/or make an appointment to meet at a mutually agreed time. Because of their teaching load and duties during the day, staff will endeavour to give an email response within 24 hours, between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. from Monday to Friday. E-mails sent to staff during the weekend will not be responded to until Monday.

Staff have professional meetings on Tuesday afternoons (3.15 - 5.00 p.m.) and Thursday afternoons (3.15 - 5.00 p.m.) so may not be available to address any concerns face-to-face on these days.

As a staff we are committed to open and positive communication with our families.

Communication with Families

Schools are busy places with lots going on. We don't want any of our school community to miss out on the things that are happening. As much as we try and share information, we ask that you actively seek out and use the following sources to keep up-to-date with key events and information.

School Newsletter

Our school newsletter is published once a fortnight, on a Thursday. This is usually emailed to families but a hard copy can be requested.

Rotokauri Website

Our <u>school website</u> features general information about the school and school event calendar.

School App

The School Stream app can be downloaded onto your smartphone to receive instant notifications of events, reminders and cancellations. This app is available on iPhone, Android and Internet explorer pages.

Facebook

The <u>school Facebook</u> page is a great way to see photos from events and read good news stories.

Please keep checking the noticeboard at the front of the school, the school calendar available on the webpage and your emails to ensure that you keep updated with events happening at school throughout the year.

Assemblies

Assemblies are held on Fridays at 2.25 - 2.45 p.m. and we are pleased to invite parents/caregivers back to these. They will be held outside the Principal's office in fine weather and inside the MPR when weather is not so good. This is a time to celebrate the successes of our students with class certificates being presented, school notices shared and classes showcasing their amazing work.

School Donations

This year the Board of Trustees has once again made the decision to leave the school donations at \$100 per child, maximum of \$250 per family. This is used to support the school budget. All donations are gratefully received and can be paid to the school office. You are able to claim a tax credit from all donations.

Tech

Our Year 7 & 8 students continue to be involved in Tech at Hamilton Junior High School.

The Technicraft fee for the year is \$100 and this can be paid to the school office. Students attending Tech on Mondays need to be at school by 8.25 a.m. They need to wear closed in shoes to attend.

PLEASE NOTE: First day of Tech is tomorrow, Friday 10 February and then Monday 13 February. Following that it will be every Monday.

Contact Details

Can you please make sure you let the office know if there are any changes to your family's circumstances, such as changes of address, phone number, email address or family arrangements. We want to ensure that everyone can be contacted if necessary.

Parking at Rotokauri School

Thank you to everyone that is complying with the carpark guidelines. Our road patrol student volunteers are new to their positions and are still training, so please be kind and patient to them.

Please remember to remain in your parked vehicles if you are in the busbay or in the bottom section of the carpark – these are two areas where vehicles are meant to move smoothly through – the bottom section is not for angle parking please.

After School Care

Unfortunately, we cannot provide After School Care at Rotokauri School. However, we are working in partnership with the Western Community Centre to make this available off-site. Students are picked up from the school at 3.00 p.m. and are taken to the Western Community Centre where they are provided care and activities, until parents/caregivers can pick them up.

COVID Update and Requirements

COVID is still present in our communities and the school will be doing our best to minimise the risk to students whilst at school. As guided by the Ministry of Education we will –

- Have hand sanitiser available in each classroom for students to use.
- Ensure that indoor spaces are well ventilated and have lots of fresh air.

It is still a requirement for schools to be notified of positive cases in families. Students can continue to attend school if they are a close contact, but need to have a negative RAT for 5 days.

Sunhats/Sunscreen

It is a school requirement that students and staff wear school sunhats in Terms 1 & 4. Sunhats must have no graffiti or embellishments on their sunhats and a toggle that ensures the sunhat stays on whilst playing. New sunhats are available from the school office.

Sunscreen is provided in each classroom. Teachers will remind students to apply sunscreen at each break but it is the responsibility of students to apply this. It is recommended that students come to school with a layer of sunscreen that has been applied at home.

Stationery

Thank you to the families that have purchased their stationery packs through Office Max. We ask that all stationery is purchased before Monday 13th February so that students can start using them.

Medical Requirements

Please ensure that you come to the school office to fill out a medical form if your child requires medication during school hours. If your child needs to use an inhaler please ensure that they are brought to school, named and in a sealed plastic bag. No medications can be administered without written permission. If medication is held at school please take the time to check expiry dates and how much medication is there during the year so that, if needed, the medication will work correctly when administered.

If your child has an allergy, is asthmatic or has other medical conditions that require a health plan please let the school office know so that these plans can be completed or updated (as per the Ministry of Health regulations).

Hearing and Vision Testing



Information Sheet on Vision and Hearing Checks in School

Vision Hearing Technicians from Community and Southern Rural Health will be visiting our school. The objective of the test is to identify previously undetected vision and hearing defects.

If any parents/caregivers **do not** want their child to be checked, or their child is currently under specialist care for a vision or hearing defect, they should let the school know.

Which children are routinely checked?

Children who have not completed vision and hearing checks as part of their B4 School Check. Children absent from previous visit, require retests or follow up. In special circumstances, parents, teachers or others may request a vision or hearing check.

What tests are carried out?

Ears

Audiometry (hearing test).

Tympanometry – middle ear function test (only carried out when hearing test is not within a normal range).

Eves

Long distance vision tests – not a complete visual examination, but a simple screening test.

NB All of these checks are non-invasive, safe and should cause no discomfort.

The Vision Hearing Technician will:

Notify parents of all test results.

Enter results on Ministry of Education database (Enrol).

The Vision Hearing Technician will obtain personal details from the school ie; names, date of birth.

If the technician needs to contact parents or caregivers following the visit, addresses and phone numbers will also be required.

Our Service may share this information with other health professionals involved in the children's care.





School Based Immunisations 2023

Dear Parents / Caregivers,

Public health nurses will be delivering two school-based immunisation programmes in your child's school during 2023.

Year Seven Students

These students will be offered the Boostrix vaccine which is a booster for their early childhood immunisations of tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (whooping cough). This is the same vaccination that would have been given to your child at 4 years age if you consented. Information about the year seven programme will be given to students at school and this session may include watching the Ministry of Health Presentation on Year Seven Immunisations and is designed specifically for this age group.

At this information session, your child will be given a consent form to bring home for you to read and choose whether or not to have your child immunised by the Public Health Nurses at school. Whether you choose to immunise or not, the form needs to be returned to school.

Year Eight Students

From 1 January 2017, Males and Females aged 9 to 26 inclusive (ie under 27 years) have been eligible for HPV (Human Papilloma virus) immunisation. The focus has historically been on cervical cancer prevention for women but increasing evidence has emerged of the impact of other HPV related cancers on men so both groups are now offered this vaccine free of charge. This vaccine will be given in two doses 6 months apart.

Information will be given to the students about the HPV vaccination programme at school. This may include viewing the Ministry of Health presentation about the HPV vaccine Information and is for the year 8 age group.

Your child will be given a consent form to bring home for you to choose whether or not to have your child immunised by the Public Health Nurses at school.

- Information on the immunisations is included on the consent form which will be given to your son / daughter at the information session.
- Please complete the consent form and answer all the questions and return the form to school.
- If your child is not being vaccinated at school you still need to fill in the section with your child's name and details on it.
- Please check with your doctor or <u>practice</u> nurse if you are unsure if your child has had a tetanus injection in the last two years.
