GENERAL INFORMATION

Class and Portrait Photos

Photographs will be taken on Thursday, 27 April (day 2 of next term). If you would like your children photographed together please return the sibling form that is on the back of the flyer that was sent home yesterday. This needs to be filled in, signed and returned to the school office <u>before</u> photo day. Family photos will not be taken without this filled in form.

After the photos a unique access key will be emailed out to you. This access key will display all the photographs of your child/ren. It is then an easy process for you to shop online and purchase the photographs you want.

Orders placed before the free delivery expiry date will be bulk printed and delivered to the school for your child to bring home.

Any orders placed after this date will be sent directly to your specified delivery address and will incur a postage and packing charge. You will see this message when you go online to view and order your photographs.

Mobile Phones

Rotokauri School has a mobile phone procedure that allows students to bring mobile phones to school, however, these need to be handed in to the office for the day. Students are not to use their phones in the busbay, before or after school. If parents/caregivers need to get a message to their child/children please go through the appropriate channels, which is to contact the office.

School Sunhats / Beanies

All school sunhats will come home on Thursday 6th April, as they are no longer needed until Term 4.

Beanies are available from the school office at a cost of \$15.00 if you would like to buy one.

When children are unwell

We kindly ask that children who are unwell remain at home until they are no longer contagious to other students. There is an increase in children coming to school with symptoms e.g. coughing, temperature and often teachers are having to send children home during the day. We also ask that the contact phone numbers are up-to-date and when phoned to pick up a child this is done promptly.

Lost Property

We cannot stress enough the importance of clearly naming your child's clothing, shoes, lunchboxes etc. Otherwise we are unable to get these back to the right person. All lost property is kept within the student foyer, please regularly check the clothes rack for any missing items. At the end of term any unnamed and unclaimed items are donated to charity.
