Just a few reminders -

- Children arriving at school before 8.30 a.m. need to sit quietly in the bus bay until the 8.30 a.m. bell rings.
- School starts at 8.55 a.m. so we would appreciate students arriving 5 10 minutes before this so that they are not disturbing their class when they come in late. We know that sometimes this is unavoidable, but for some families this is a regular occurrence, which can amount to quite a bit of lost schooling and also does not make the children feel good.
- School beanies are available for sale from the school office for \$15.00.
- On Tuesdays and Thursdays staff have meetings after school, starting at 3.15 p.m. This means that the children waiting for pick up are not able to be supervised from 3.15 p.m. onwards.

COVID and Measles

There have been some cases of COVID in our school this term. When notified by parents the teachers will let families know so that they can monitor their child/children for any symptoms. It is very difficult at this time of year to distinguish between a cold,

flu or COVID, so testing is important. We do have some kits at school if anyone needs them.

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
