PRINCIPAL'S PIECE

Well the cold weather has had an impact on everyone - some slippery surfaces and chilly mornings. Please remember to ensure that students have a number of layers of clothing which they can remove as the days warm up.

Some reminders please (with a slightly firmer tone than usual)

- **Secondary students** whilst we love seeing our former students returning to Rotokauri School can we please ask that they do not come onto the school grounds during the hours of 9 a.m. 3 p.m. as our students are working during these hours.
- Parent interviews this is a time for parents/caregivers to learn about their child's learning and to unpack the school report. Please do not bring preschoolers or students younger than Year 7 or 8 into the classroom for the interviews. Due to the fact that it will be dark outside there will be no supervision available and it is recommended that children are not left unsupervised on the school playgrounds.
- Attendance one of the BOT roles is to monitor student's attendance. On the school report there is a heading for attendance. To achieve at a satisfactory level, according to the Ministry of Education, a child needs to be attending school for 90% of the time. If a child's attendance is low then the BOT may send home a letter requesting some additional information.

- Lateness just as important as attendance, there needs to be a commitment by families to get students to school on time, every day. Time missed in the mornings can quickly add up. School is open from 8.30 a.m. and the bell to start school rings at 8.55 a.m. It is hoped that students arrive 10 minutes early in order to organize themselves with classroom routines and to find friends to play with at the start of the day. Arriving late can be embarrassing for the student and sometimes causes interruptions to classes that have already started. If a child's lateness becomes an issue, then the BOT may send home a letter requesting that this improves. If your child is late please remind them to sign in on the VisTab at the school office before going to class.
- COVID tracking and guidelines yes COVID is still around and has been in our school this year. Thank you to the families that have notified us that their child is a contact or a positive case. Once the school is notified this information is shared with the classroom teacher. The teacher will then send out an email to all families in that class telling them of a positive case. Students would need to be monitored to ensure that they do not develop symptoms of COVID, which would then require testing. Students with COVID need to remain at home for 7 days and then can return to school. Students that are close contacts may continue coming to school, however for the first 5 days they need to be tested and get a negative result. If unsure please give the school a call and check.
- Carpark Behaviour one of our school values which we would like to remind parents/caregivers/extended family about is RESPECT. There have been a number of incidents recently that have not been respectful to staff and we would like to encourage adults to change their behaviour in the carpark. We understand all the frustrations with finding a carpark etc but the school has worked hard to get a solution. Not many schools, if any, have their entire staff on duty in the carpark after school. It would be appreciated if drivers could
 - Not park on the yellow lines.
 - Speak respectfully to all staff, at all times if you have a complaint or concern about the carparking please send an email to <u>dsmith@rotokauri.school.nz</u>
 - Not park in the disabled carpark, unless you have a legitimate Disabled Parking card displayed in your front window
 - Stay in your vehicle if you have driven into the busbay area if you get out of the vehicle and wander off to find your child you disrupt the flow of traffic
 - Overtaking in the busbay area is not recommended please be patient and wait in line for the vehicles in front of you to move.

It is important that children get promptly into the parked cars so that the vehicles can move on quickly.

Property Update

All the concrete has been laid for the building project and the builders are just completing the finishing touches on the Room 9 & 10 building. The next part of the project is the driveway and turning bay, as well as the arrival of the new furniture. We are hoping to get the Year 8 students into the new class at the beginning of Term 3.

School Donations/Tech Fees

Rotokauri School has set their school donations at \$100 per student, \$250 for a family. This has remained the same for a number of years and is one of the cheapest in our area. Thank you to the families that have already paid their school fees for the year. We would like to encourage families that have not paid yet to start making a contribution, as schools run on very tight budgets (and in deficit), so every little bit extra is appreciated and helps us to provide opportunities for all our students.

Staff Sick Leave

Just like all working adults, sometimes our staff get sick and cannot attend school. Whilst every effort is made to find a reliever for the class for that day, sometimes this is not achievable. It is also not always possible for the Principal or Deputy Principal to supervise the class either as they have commitments in their own roles within the school. One option that some schools have chosen, is to notify parents of the unavailability of a teacher and encouraging children to learn from home. This is not an option that the BOT wish to follow as we value children's attendance at school. Therefore, the option that the school will be undertaking is – the teacher setting work for the students that can be accomplished independently and the class is split across the school. This ensures that the children's learning is maintained and they are in a safe environment. Please trust that decisions such as this are not taken lightly and all possible options have been explored before having to do this.
