

BOT NEWS

BOT Committee

Car Parking at Exit 2

It has been brought to our attention that there are some negative and incorrect statements being shared amongst the parent community regarding the new carpark – Exit 2. This has resulted in verbal abuse being directed at staff members – this is not acceptable behaviour. The staff are working hard to get students safely into vehicles in a prompt manner so as not to hold up parents, some of whom are very impatient. It is not appropriate to do u-turns in the new driveway due to frustration.

The school staff and BOT were **not** responsible for designing and/or developing this project – this was a Ministry of Education decision. Also, the school budget/funds were **not** used for this project – this project was undertaken by the Ministry of Education networking due to roll growth. The Ministry of Education have been spoken to by the Principal and BOT members about the difficulties with the turning circle and the entranceway but nothing decisive has been forthcoming – we will keep pressure on the Ministry of Education to acknowledge and correct the design if possible.

The most important school value that overarches all behaviour is RESPECT and we would like to think that all school community members are upholding this value.

Digital Citizenship

Attached to this newsletter is our school's junior and senior school Digital Citizenship agreements. We support safe and responsible use of the internet for teaching and learning. To be a good digital citizen we –

School Donations

Our school donation for 2024 has been set at \$100 per child, \$250 for 3 or more children. The Board of Trustees have kept this low payment amount for a number of years. Thank you to all our parents who pay the donation every year and those that have paid so promptly this year. In 2023 the total donations that could be collected amounted to \$18,000 – unfortunately only 60% of families contributed which meant that \$11,000 was donated.

Why do we need your donation? Schools in New Zealand are funded on a per pupil basis. This is a set figure across the country and based on the equity index allocated to the school. We receive less funding than high equity index schools across the country so **we need your help!**

By having as many families as possible pay the school donation this significantly improves the resources we can provide on a day to day basis and ensures that we can provide more opportunities for our learners to flourish, achieve their full potential and enjoy their primary school years.

If you pay your donation before the end of the financial year, March 31st 2024, then you are eligible to claim a rebate from the IRD. As an added incentive the school will be placing the names of families that have paid their school donation in term 1 into a draw for a \$100 dinner voucher.

We encourage you to support your child's education by supporting the school by paying the donation so we can continue to provide the high quality teaching and learning programmes that you expect.

We know that for some of our families paying the school donation all at once is difficult. For this reason you can make part payments each school term.


