Week 4 already. Some brisk mornings with beautiful sunny days to follow. The school is buzzing with learning and extra opportunities for the students.

#### From the Board:

Carpark behaviour - the Board are disappointed to hear about the ongoing inappropriate behaviour shown by a small group of drivers - driving around the STOP sign up onto the footpath, walking with students and preschoolers behind cars that could potentially back out, blocking entry or exit points because drivers don't like parking in particular areas, allowing children to get in and out of vehicles on the wrong side, drivers exiting cars in the busbay, dropping off students in the middle of the carpark. These behaviours are recorded on our security cameras. The BOT will be acting on complaints from the school about behaviour that undermines or endangers the staff or students. Further action may be taken if this behaviour does not improve.

Lateness - not only are the Board responsible for monitoring attendance of students but they are also shared information about patterns of lateness. The first bell for the start of school rings at 8.55 a.m. NOT 9.00 a.m. Please ensure that your child/children is arriving at school prior to this first bell.

#### Class and Portrait Photos


#### **Junior Football Tournament 2025**
