#### **Employment changes**

The BOT would like to thank Mrs Mary Evans for taking on the role of Room 1 teacher for the remainder of the year. Mrs Suz Brosnan will be in the school as a classroom release teacher. We would also like to congratulate Mrs Selma Booyens for accepting the Room 5 vacancy. She will be opening our 10th classroom with the New Entrant children starting during Term 3 & 4. We would also like to welcome Miss Kat McGonigal to the Rotokauri team, she will be the teacher aide in Room 5.

#### Ballot

It is always exciting to watch the changes happening in the school. We have the most students ever attending Rotokauri School and have the most staff and classrooms. The school has an enrolment scheme, which has been approved by the Ministry of Education. This is in place to avoid overcrowding, or the likelihood of overcrowding. This allows for students that live within the home zone to be enrolled in their local school.

The enrolment of out-of-zone students is governed by the provisions of the Education Act 1989. This allows for the school to run a ballot in October for a set number of students that the school can accommodate.

The Board of Trustees has decided that the ballot for children wishing to enrol in 2026 will be for 20 Year 1 students. Please notify the school as soon as possible if you wish to enrol your child in 2026 as the numbers are limited and we need to follow the enrolment priority criteria.

#### **BOT Elections**

Schools nationally will be holding their triennial elections in September this year. The BOT have decided that the election date for Rotokauri School will be Wednesday 10th September 2025 and they have appointed Ms Sarah Dyer as the school's Returning Officer. Timeframe for school elections:

#### Agricultural Day

#### **Parent-Teacher Interviews**

Parent-Teacher Interviews will be held on Wednesday 16 July and Thursday 17 July, from 1.30 p.m. to 7.00 p.m. These interviews are an opportunity for you to receive your child's mid-year report and discuss learning goals for the remainder of the year. Families with multiple children enrolled at Rotokauri School will be given access to the website first (today via email) and then it will be open to other families. Please refer to the School Interviews booking Instructions for the booking code and details on how to book a time using the website. This allows our parents to have back-to-back interviews if they have more than one child at school.

To help keep the focus on your child's learning, we kindly ask that preschoolers do not attend the interviews. Please make alternative arrangements for their care.

On these days, we ask that students are picked up between 12.30 - 1.00 p.m. If families are not able to do this, alternative arrangements will be made for them at school (e.g. watching a movie in the MPR, supervised by available staff).

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

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
