#### REPORTING

In February/March we will be sharing with our community the 2014 National Standards results. Our target for 2014 involved 51 students in the curriculum area of maths. These students have done really well in 2014 and should be congratulated. What parents need to understand is that National Standards reporting is not a fair or transparent way of reporting, in that it doesn't show progress within a standard band. The way the Ministry asks schools to report gives parents the negative assumption that the child has not improved unless they have gone to another National Standard level and this is not true. This can be both frustrating and demoralizing for both students and staff.

All of our students have made progress in one way or another and our students, staff and parents should be commended for their combined (team) effort.

When looking at your child's report (Senior School) look at the comments and effort ratings because that will tell you more than a prescribed rating. Hopefully, within the comments you will see parts of your child's personality that you can relate to.

Celebrate your child's efforts and successes no matter how small they may seem. I get more of a kick out of reading my own children's reports when they talk about them as a person rather than a result.

#### STAFF AND STUDENTS

Our staff in 2014 have been absolutely brilliant in trying to support our student's individual and collective needs. They are so professional and yet have a great sense of fun. They are always open to new ideas and are continually trying new things with our students to get the best out of them. They are the culture of our school and lead by example by 'walking the talk'.
