STUDENTS CROSSING ROTOKAURI ROAD

We have run a road safety lesson for the 9 students who frequently cross the road outside our school. We thought it timely that we revisit this because of the increasing number of cars that use Rotokauri Road as a way of getting to The Base and the Te Rapa industrial area.

CAR PARK SAFETY

Car park safety is always of utmost concern for schools who have parents and students entering and departing by car on school property.

We have outlined our expectations when using the car park and these can be seen on the sign above the loading zone. The major problem we have is people leaving their cars in the loading zone and then walking off and leaving their car unattended. This obviously clogs up the whole entry into the school and this then causes a backlog which stretches out along the road, causing further hazards. **Do not** at any stage leave your car unattended in the loading zone. Talk to your child and make sure they are waiting for you, seated in the covered bus stop. This will help to elevate the congestion problem. If they do not come to the bus stop promptly please move along to an available car park so that this area is freed up quickly.

The other issue we have is parents/grandparents walking across the car park without using the designated pedestrian crossings. At best this is poor role modelling and at worst you are basically encouraging your child to take risks that could endanger their lives. Please use the pedestrian crossings at all times.

RIDING TO SCHOOL

Years ago a high percentage of New Zealand's school population would ride to school on a daily basis. If you look around schools now you will see the rows of bike racks that have almost been consigned to history.

We have a bike policy at our school and this stipulates students need to be 10 years of age to ride their bike to school.

Any child who is under ten but still wants to ride to school requires a letter written by a parent or caregiver to be given to the Principal. Any child riding to school must have a fully approved helmet.

RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION

Our school has had Religious Instruction for many years and this is well supported by our community, as shown by the feedback from our Community Consultation process.

Religious Instruction is far different now from when my generation went to school. Each lesson is broken into sections. Here is an example directly from the Religious Instruction Curriculum.

Purpose - For students to understand the importance of people in a community working together.

Values Taught - Community and Participation.

Main Point - People in a community need to work together.

Student Experience - Considering situations where working together is important. Application to school - Working together improves students and teachers confidence and contributes to their sense of purpose and belonging.

Although this is a quick snap shot of the curriculum I do like the way they promote the values, which is very much in keeping with what we promote as part of our school values (honesty, excellence, persistence, respect and responsibility).

FISHING TOURNAMENT

We have been doing this for so long that it has become part of our culture. There's a couple of families who have turned this into an annual weekend away. On behalf of the school community a big thank you to Mike Watkins for organising such a great event.
