
NEW CURRICULUM

We are entering an exciting stage of Rotokauri School history, as we are always looking after the best interests of students socially, emotionally and educationally. Educationally it is our job to make sure that our students are prepared for the jobs that will exist when they start joining the workforce. As suggested in a previous newsletter, some people say you can't prepare them for a work environment that does not yet exist. Through attending future education courses and tapping into some of the world's most forward thinking people we have begun to revise our curriculum in an exciting way, which

will further engage our students. Only a couple of weeks ago the staff spent five hours with Trevor Bond, a facilitator who specialises in getting teachers to think about future teaching practice. We have asked students, staff and teachers about what they see as important about learning and crafted this into the Rotokauri Curriculum. We know from various researched educational material that for our students to be successful and full participants of not only New Zealand society but also world citizens they will need to be risk takers, collaborators, problem solvers, creators, questioners and communicators. These are going to require our students to have key skills and attitudes which we are currently developing. We are also developing a four level rubric for all of these skills which show a level of development and expectation as we would for other subjects e.g. maths. These skills and attributes would also be used as part of our reporting to parents.

CAR PARK SAFETY






PARENT QUESTIONNAIRE REVIEW

Q1 In your opinion is your child/children currently engaged in learning



Q3 Do you find various forms of technology that we have at school useful to your child's learning?



Q4 Do you feel that technology is an important component of a modern education programme?



Q5 How do you know if your child is progressing in learning?



Q6 Do you think your child takes risks with their learning?




Q7 Does your child ask questions at home?



CLASSROOM RELEASE

We have a number of new parents in the school who may not be aware of Classroom Release Time for teachers. This has been a part of the Secondary Teachers Collective contract for many years and has been a part of the NZEI for approximately 7 years. This allows all teachers who are contracted for at least 4 days a week to receive 2 non contact days per term. Classroom Release Time means that teachers are doing one of the following things to support the learning of the students:

Professional Development Conferencing of students Individual testing of students Assessment and evaluation Reporting to management Reporting to parents Observing of other teachers Planning and preparation Record keeping

During this time you will find that teachers are on site working with students e.g. testing and evaluating in one of our release areas.

TOUGHLOVE WAIKATO

On the 26th May I was fortunate to attend a promotional presentation for schools designed to demonstrate how the principles and practices of the 'Toughlove' program can assist parents who are experiencing unacceptable behavior in their homes.

From the 'Toughlove' brochure:

"You have done your best. Some boundaries and consequences haven't worked as well as you would have liked. You want cooperation and respect and you want your kids to learn to be responsible for their own actions. You may feel that you are being manipulated, but you are having trouble with the manipulation."

The 'Toughlove' philosophy encourages a self-help approach to solving family issues. 'Toughlove' offers families supportive parent meetings as a way of showing parents how they can help one another. This helps parents and kids gain confidence. 'Toughlove' does not aim to punish kids, but shows parents how to come up with loving solutions to help with family problems by teaching self-responsibility.




