What a tremendous success our recent Art Week was for our staff, students and community. Our school is brimming with artistic talent in all age groups.


A number of friends of the school have sent us artwork to be auctioned off online on Trademe.

All the pieces of work are currently displayed on the wall outside my office. Feel free to view them at your leisure.












HEALTH AND SAFETY LEGISLATION

READING IS SO IMPORTANT FOR YOUNG CHILDREN

A reading survey conducted by Paper Plus shows that only 6% of Dads read to their children on a regular basis. The survey shows that less than half of the Dads read to the children at all and if they do its only once a week. Research suggests that the earlier students can be introduced to print the more beneficial it will be for them.

Children love their Dads reading to them especially when dads see it as a fun experience and use different voices for characters. The key to reading to children is to read slowly and with plenty of expression as this tends to grab the students attention.

ENROLMENT PROCEDURES

Last week the Board had Gavin Sowrey from the Ministry of Education in to talk to us about demographics of the Rotokauri / Western Corridor Region and any changes that might affect our school over the years.

Firstly, our school enrolment boundaries are not going to change to cater for any property development in the near future. So anyone wanting to come to our school from outside of the zone will have to come in via a ballot (as per usual).

Secondly, as a school we will have to fund any further building of classrooms out of the school Board money. The Ministry only funds classrooms where in zone population growth has taken place.

What this means is that we need to be very careful when running a ballot. To run a ballot we need to know what the projected numbers will be for the future. If you are planning on leaving the school community at the end of 2015 please inform us so that we can act on the information accordingly.

We spend a lot of time with the staff of Hamilton Zoo, as they are our neighbours and continually help us out with numerous school projects. Samantha will be sadly missed by all who knew her.

TOUGHLOVE PARENT INFORMATION EVENING

Thank you to the parents who attended. Please find below a summary of the information given on the night:

- You are the parent not your child's friend.
- · Say "no" and mean it.

Give considered responses. Ask to get back to your child on something after you have thought about it rather than react to a situation and then regret it.

Be consistent! Both parents need to back each other up. Be aware if you are being manipulated.

Do not enter into long running arguments. Walk away even if you feel bad. It is the parent's job to make tough decisions. Children's brains are not sufficiently wired to do this for themselves. Again be consistent and if you say "no" mean it.

Ignore tantrums, crying and whinging.

Whose "life pile" does the problem belong to?

Let children take consequences for their actions. Don't "save" them from consequences.....For example: if their homework is not done....and you have reminded them to do it....don't write a note to the teacher excusing your child's lack of time management. As life goes on consequences for poor choices will become more unpalatable!

Have consequences for poor behaviour and bad choices.

Consequences should be related to the behaviour and be immediate/or expected where possible. For example if you cannot immediately think of an appropriate consequence, give yourself time to think of one by saying something like "There will be a consequence, I will tell you at dinner time what it will be."

Again, be consistent. Stick to what you have said you will do.
