My name is Lois Amery and I am excited and pleased to be Room 4's teacher for the rest of the year. A lot of the children have already met me as a reliever in the school. I have been teaching for many years. I like to create a positive, supportive and caring learning environment for the children in class.

I am looking forward to getting to know the children, their families and the community of Rotokauri.

#### BELL TIMES

The two bells is a signal to the students to have a drink, go to the toilet and head into class. The one bell is when class time starts.

If you are delivering your child to class late, please do not interrupt class time. It would be helpful if you encourage your child to enter quietly and join in whatever activity is happening. The one bell at 9.00 a.m. indicates the parents need to leave children to start their learning.

## RUBBISH

Rubbish, lost property and sports equipment lying around is a continual problem around the school. We brainstormed ideas with the students about how they can take responsibility for ensuring that the school is tidy.

The staff used ideas suggested by the students to develop a "whole school rubbish clean- up" project.

Every afternoon as part of the usual classroom clean-up routine, students from each room will make sure that the designated area outside their room is litter free. The areas also have to be free of lost property and sports equipment, as these have also been of concern.

A map of classroom areas has been provided to each classroom, as well as there being one on display on the staffroom window.

Miss Hamer and Room 3 have taken responsibility for monitoring the project and inspecting areas. Thank you.

## **ROTOKAURI TUIS 2013**

We are excited to be launching choir in Term 2. Thank you to all of you who have put your name down. We are excited to have almost 50 Tuis this year! A large number like that will empty the playground on Monday lunchtimes!

We are fortunate to be involved in Kids for Kids this year. This programme is organised by World Vision and children all over New Zealand take part. This concert will be on 6 August this year at Founders Theatre with Nathan King as the guest singer. Our year fours and older will be taking part in this concert. This year we are coming up to the 21<sup>st</sup> century level by having the choir music available to choir members electronically rather than using CDs (we are trying to keep up with the times <sup>(2)</sup>).

#### **GIFTED AND TALENTED PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT 2013**

Last year we applied for Gifted and Talented Professional Development through the Ministry of Education. We were fortunate to be successful with our application.

From the GATE Professional Development Programme schools can expect training that :-

- enables teachers to become effective culturally responsive teachers for all students
- is based on research that has been demonstrated to have a positive effect on valued student outcomes.
- will improve student engagement
- will involve analysing student data in order to lift overall student achievement
- is flexible and responsive to the professional leaning needs of teachers and school leaders
- will increase teacher's knowledge to enable effective culturally responsive teaching and learning for gifted and talented students
- will build the capability of the school to sustain continuous improvement
- will support the development of e-learning and the use of ICT so that different ways of learning can be supported.

## SPECIAL EDUCATION NEWS TERM ONE

During Weeks 1-6, we were completing assessments that provide information for organising programmes for children that need assistance.

Every child in Room's 1 and 2 were assessed on Alphabet knowledge and on basic sight words. Running Records were completed on every child in the school.

I have completed a Learning Support Register for those children who will require assistance. This list is partly based on the P.A.T results, other assessments and teacher judgements. Needs have been identified in Literacy and Numeracy, programmes have been put in place and teaching of small groups both outside of and within the classroom began in Week 7.

Mrs Raewyn O'Brien is working in the Junior School with small groups of children on improving alphabet knowledge, word lists and text reading. She is also assisting with a writing group in Room 1.

We also have Toni Rae working with 4 groups of 4 children requiring support for Mathematics from the middle to senior area of the school.

I am running groups across the Senior Syndicate working on improving comprehension and increasing vocabulary knowledge. It is hoped that the skills these children learn in these groups can be transferred into classroom programmes.

Students included in additional learning programmes will be re-assessed by mid Term 2. New groups of students will be chosen or new learning goals and teaching strategies will be put in place for the remainder of the year.

Two children have been discontinued from Reading Recovery and another two children are being assessed to start the programme.

We are very fortunate to have had 3 children accepted onto the roll of the Resource Teacher of Literacy. Mrs Elspeth Oliver will we working with these children in a small group of their classroom peers working at a similar level to increase their literacy knowledge and reading and writing strategies. Mrs Oliver also works very closely with the classroom teachers of these children, in order that skills and strategies learnt in her sessions are applied in classroom programmes.

The RTLB's have also accepted a referral from our Senior School to work with our teachers on improving student achievement in Writing. The RTLB will collect school data, make observations and plan a programme that is intended to increase teacher capacity in planning and providing classroom writing programmes that will benefit all learners. 

## Stand up for Kids - Protect our Schools Rally

Educators around New Zealand are joining marches and rallies on Saturday 13 April because we're concerned about the impact the Government's education policies are having on children and their learning.

## Hamilton Rally Details:

11am at the Band Rotunda (Memorial Park cnr Bridge & Victoria Sts). We will be marching across Bridge St bridge, into Grey St, through the shopping centre to Steel Park for BBQ and speakers.

Educators have had enough of the Government's refusal to listen, respect or even properly pay the people at the heart of our schools. Instead, it is bulldozing through policies that we know are bad for children.

Whether it's the rushed and flawed implementation of National Standards, the botched implementation of Novopay, the hasty mergers and closures of schools in Christchurch, the imposition of league tables, the introduction of charter schools that don't have to employ qualified teachers, we are asking the Government to stop, look and listen to the voice of educators and school communities.

We want to make sure we have a strong, vibrant, well-resourced public education system that invests in our children.

We're asking you to join us - to stand up for kids and defend our world-beating education system from failed overseas policies based on privatisation, competition and a one-size-fits-all approach to children's learning.

These events are being organised by NZEI Te Riu Roa members, who together represent 50,000 people working in education.




