MĀORI STUDENT SURVEY

Last Friday our students that are classified as Māori (Years 4-8) completed a survey based on questions supplied by parents and staff. The Ministry of Education have indicated that Māori students are a priority group and their progress will be tracked by the Education Review Office. Completing these sorts of self-reviews is nothing out of the ordinary for our school.

GREAT TEAM

One of the greatest assets a school can have is the teaching staff and the effort that they put into building positive, professional relationships with the students. Each year I spend time reviewing our staff using an attestation approach which is determined by the Ministry of Education.

It's always a joy to go in and watch students interact within the Rotokauri learning environment. It's only when I see consistency across the school that I make written comments to the Board and school community.

Here are a few of the things our staff and community can be proud of:

- Our teachers are continually doing both personnel and collective professional development to make sure they are up to date with the latest teaching philosophies.
- Teachers are communicating more frequently with parents through emails.
- Information technology is being used seamlessly throughout the curriculum areas to support learning in a collaborative way. Students are becoming more independent as learners.
- Teachers are putting an amazing amount of effort into lessons to make sure they are relevant to the student's needs. Some fantastic resources have been created by teachers at our school.
- The type of questions our students are asking show that students are very engaged in their learning.
- Teachers are using student data to make decisions on their planning and teaching practise. Teachers are planning for individual needs on social and academic levels.
- Teachers are planning more within syndicates. The school is using its strengths to support the needs of the teachers.
- Teachers are using a student inquiry approach to support the learning of the students.
- Teachers are catering for and tracking the progress of target students.
- Teachers are incorporating more Te Reo into their term planning schedules.

Of course as with any organisation we are always seeking to become better and this year the staff have worked hard on developing a new curriculum with the emphasis on skills and attitudes that will help our students be valuable citizens in a global society.

HEARING AND VISION CHECKS

The Hearing and Vision Technician will be at Rotokauri School on 31st August 2016. Not all children will be tested. New Entrants, Year 7 and any other child that needs follow up checks could be seen on the day. If you do not want your child tested, please contact the school office. Please read the following information sheet.



Information sheet on hearing and vision checks in school

Vision Hearing Technicians from Rural and Community Services will be visiting our school.

The objective of the vision is to identify previously undetected hearing and vision defects.

Which children are routinely checked?

catch up screening for children who have not completed hearing and vision checks as part of their B4 school check children absent from previous visit, require re-tests or follow up in special circumstances, parents, teachers or others may request a hearing or vision check new immigrants

What tests are carried out?

Ears

audiometry – hearing test tympanometry – middle ear function test (only carried out when hearing test is not within a normal range)

Eyes

long distance vision tests – not a complete visual examination, but a simple screening test colour vision tests (Year 7 boys only)

NB All these checks are non-invasive, safe and should cause no discomfort.

The Vision Hearing Technician will:

notify parents of all test results enter results on ministry of education data base (ENROL)

The vision hearing technician will obtain personal details from the school i.e names, dates of birth, ethnicity.

If the technician needs to contact parents or caregivers following the visit, addresses and phone numbers will also be required.

Community services may share this information with other health professionals involved in the children's care.

If any parent or caregiver does not want their child to be checked, or their child is currently under specialist care for a hearing or vision defect, they should let the technician know by leaving a message with the school.



ROOM 6 BIRD HOUSES

In the last week of Term 2 we designed and built bird houses for our local birds. The week long project was a great way to end our flight inquiry. We started off by researching the types of birds that would live in the Rotokauri area and as a group decided on which bird we would want to come live in our house. Next we drew a plan using our knowledge of measurement and creativity. Next we drew out the template and began to saw. The challenging aspect of our project was nailing into two pieces of timber and sawing straight. It was fun seeing everyone's creations they made and working as a team. We are very proud of our bird houses.

As an appetiser here are some interesting segments from the film:

- Every school in France has a four course lunch for the students, one serving is usually cheese.
- Every Italian employee is allowed to have a 2 hour lunch break. This is often when families sit down for a meal together and talk.
- Every employee in Germany is given 4 weeks holiday and are paid an additional month on top of their 12 calendar months.
- German managers are not allowed to call their staff or communicate outside of office hours.

Watch the documentary and I think you will enjoy it. There's some great stuff in there about education.
