SUPPORTING OUR STUDENTS

I'm always amazed at the programmes/assessments that New Zealand teachers/schools have in place to support student's academic and social needs. Did you know we have the following things occurring in our school -

- 5 year old entry checks when students first arrive at school.
- 6 year net administered after one year at school.
- Support teachers/teacher aides employed to help gifted and talented students.
- Support teachers/teacher aides employed to help target students with their learning needs.
- Special literacy programmes within classrooms to support reading and writing.
- Reading recovery programme.

Not to mention the various individual support programmes that all our teachers are running for students.

The list of what our teachers actually do for our students could go on and on. The days when teachers stand at the front and lecture to students has definitely been consigned to the dark ages.

AFTER SCHOOL PROCEDURE

The carpark and entrance way to the school is rather chaotic due to the number of students leaving in one big group at 3.00 p.m. and the volume of cars using the carpark. As a way of helping at this time of day the following steps have been put in place (effective from last week) –

- Students will be released promptly from their classrooms by 3.05 p.m.
- Students will assemble in the bus bay area unless parents are waiting outside their classrooms to pick them up. Please do not make arrangements to meet

- your child/children in other areas of the school, unless you are there at 3.00 p.m. to pick them up.
- Students may play on the playgrounds if they are actively supervised by an adult.
- Parents of road patrol monitors are requested to find a carpark rather than waiting in the bus bay.

The bus bay area is for picking up children and then leaving – it has not been designed for parking for long periods whilst waiting for students or for leaving your vehicle in order to find your child.

The one thing I have learned about students is never under estimate their ability to put their thoughts onto paper and problem solve complex situations. To whom it may concern,

Our car park has some serious issues that need to be dealt with.

One of these issues involves the main road! There are too many cars sitting in the middle of the road so this blocks the sight of bystanders trying to cross, consequently increasing the chance of an accident to occur! If you help us, we could create more car parks to increase the speed of the flow!

This car park may have some problems but not as bad as the next one! Parents park on the other side of the bus stop then they walk across the road, grab their kids and walk back across the road to their car! Is that safe? If we increase the amount of walkways we could stop that!

Our bike stand doesn't have a safe and secure pathway meaning students can't leave safely. This is a serious problem and it needs to be fixed. If we craft a safe pathway along the side of the car park it would be much safer.

To whom it may concern,

The Rotokauri School car park is an extremely unsafe place. For a start, we have 4 Road Patrol members, all of which are students. 3 of them have to go onto the road to block the cars properly. Is this really safe?

Secondly, students get cold in the bus bay because their parents can't afford before school care. This could lead to sickness from exposure to cold, meaning that students can't go to school.

Thirdly, parents can do things against the rules or laws with only eye-witnesses. Is this reliable? If somebody gets severely injured or killed, the police might not be able to find the person who did it.

Now, I know that this sounds rather bad, but I have some good solutions for you. Firstly, for the Road Patrol members, we can replace them with automatic swing gates and car sensors from the hospital and The Base, respectively. There will be key cards for the teachers as well.

Secondly, for the bus stop, I suggest adding a front wall with windows and glass doors, lighting, and heating. (Surround sound optional but recommended.)

And lastly of all, to help stop parents breaking rules, I suggest we add security cameras to record anything and everything that happens.

PARENTING IS IMPORTANT

As a parent I watch the media with great interest as a school somehow comes under the spotlight for actions of students who attend the institution. The ball season for high schools must be an absolute nightmare.

The achievement of children academically and socially is based on the time and value parents place on parenting.

Students actually only spend 15% of their time in school. North Carolina State University, Brigham Young University and the University of California have all published studies of parent involvement and the success that it can bring. While we think there must be some special secret to parenting the actual data shows that it's as simple as spending time with children. The one thing that really made the difference was talking to their children - having discussions about school and how their day went. Valuing education within the household also made a dramatic difference to student achievement. But the research also revealed something else - that parents of all backgrounds don't need to buy expensive educational toys or digital devices for their children in order to give them the edge. They don't need to chauffeur their offspring to enrichment or test-prep courses either. What they need to do is simply talk.
