ROTOKAURI SCHOOL POOL - WE NEED YOUR HELP

The feedback from the Community Consultation supports the continuation of the opening of the school pool. Each year more and more pools are closed at educational facilities. To keep our pool going we need somebody to organise and run a pool roster that would go from 28th November – 24th March. Also, please contact the office if you are prepared to help with looking after the school pool. In return for your time helping to keep the pool running, you will be given a pool key free of charge for the 2016 / 17 swimming season.

POOL KEYS

This year the price of a key for the school swimming pool will be \$75.00. This allows you access to the swimming pool and the tennis court for the summer months. Keys will be available later in November once our Helpers Roster is filled. Before you are issued with a key you will need to carefully read the pool contract, sign the contract and pay your \$75. One of the most important rules is that keys are **NOT** to be passed onto other family members or given to older siblings who are swimming unsupervised. Unfortunately if key holders do not follow the rules they will be asked to return their key, with no refund.

DONATIONS

Thank you to all the parents who paid their donation this year. It is much appreciated as it contributes to the running of the school. It is not too late to support the school with a donation - \$100.00 per child for the year or a maximum of \$250.00 for a family.

CARPARKING

The loading zone is a continual issue at our school and to get one hundred cars through the loading zone in a timely fashion is difficult, even with fine weather. I know that parents become frustrated with waiting to enter the school grounds for pick ups. However, going through the loading zone is not the only option that is available. Some of our parents park down Bagust Road or Bunyard Lane. Well done. Starting this week we will be reopening the bottom carpark. Last year we only had four families that regularly used this carpark. Feedback from them was that it is a quick and efficient way to pick up their children. We would like to encourage more parents to pick up their children from this carpark – all it requires is parents informing their children where they will meet them in the afternoons.

If we all do our little bit to help with the congestion we can make a difference.

TEACHER ONLY AFTERNOON





CLASSES FOR 2017

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

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














BABY SITTER AVAILABLE
