PRINCIPAL'S PIECE

We start the year with our biggest starting roll of 202 students and having 8 classes operating. In the classes, routines are being established, testing has begun and programmes are underway. Thank you to the families that have organised stationery for their children.

This year we have three new staff members that join our TEAM at Rotokauri School. Welcome to Mr Hans Verberne, Mrs Tracy Hopewell and Mrs Casey Sanders.

Mr Verberne is our new school caretaker, and we thank him already for the amount of work he has done over the last month tidying the school and making it safe for the staff and students to start the year. Mrs Hopewell comes to us from Te Awamutu Primary and will be teaching in Room 2. Mrs Sanders is returning from maternity leave and will be teaching in Room 7.

A warm welcome to our new families that have enrolled at Rotokauri. We hope you enjoy your association with the school and quickly get to know the staff and parents in this wonderful community. Rotokauri School is a great place to work in and it is important that you and your children feel that it is a great place to learn in. The most important thing you can do for your child, is to get to know and form positive relationships with his or her teachers. Please make sure you take the time to pop in and say hello or send an email to their classroom teacher, and come along to our Meet the Teacher evening. The holidays have been a busy time at the school with the refurbishment of the multi-purpose room. Unfortunately our MPR and administration block are 'leaky'

buildings' and the Ministry of Education are rectifying this over the next 3 – 4 months. We appreciate that this will cause some disruption and inconvenience, and we apologise for this. We will keep you updated as the project develops.

The holiday period has also been a time when we have had a number of incidents occur on the school grounds. There has been vandalism with the students bird houses deliberately smashed down from the trees.

If you are aware of who the culprits are please report them to the school office. We would like your help to ensure that our school grounds are protected from this type of behaviour in the future, so ask that if you see something happening you take down information such as number plates, possibly photograph what has happened or if safe, ask the offenders to leave the school grounds. The BOT have been informed about the incidents and will be investigating ways to increase our school security. We have an exciting year planned and here are some main events to look forward to this term –

GENERAL MATTERS

ABSENCES

This is an important request and thank you in advance. If your child is absent from school please notify the school office by either phone or email. The school needs to know the reason for the child's absence as well, as this is recorded on our Student Management System and is a Ministry requirement. It would be appreciated if this could be done before 9.00 am.

SIGN IN SHEET

All people entering the school within the hours of 9.00 a.m – 2.30 p.m must use the sign in sheet at the office. This includes when you are dropping your child off at school late – please ensure that they have notified the school office of their arrival.

SWIMMING POOL UPDATE

Thank you to the pool volunteers who have kept the school pool looking fantastic during the holidays. I am certain all the key holders have appreciated your efforts, as on many occasions when staff have been at school over the holidays, the pool has been well used.

Thank you also to our caretaker for displaying the beautiful artwork that Mrs Skiffington and some of our students produced last year.

On a sad note, it is disappointing to hear about dangerous incidents that have occurred in the pool area. Teenagers diving from the roof of the buildings or the fence into the pool is incredibly dangerous and inappropriate behaviour. If you know who these young people are please let us know. To all key holders, please remember that you signed a pool agreement to adhere to the rules outlined within the contract. Allowing teenagers to swim unsupervised is not appropriate and keys will be removed from key holders.

SCHOOL DONATIONS

This year the Board of Trustees has made the decision to leave the school donations at \$100 per child, maximum of \$250 per family. This is used to support the school budget. All donations are gratefully received and can be paid to the school office. You are able to claim a tax credit from all donations.

MATHS WHIZZ

Again this year the students are able to access the Maths Whizz programme at school and home. Teachers will be using Maths Whizz in their classroom Maths programmes. The cost for the entire year is \$30 per student, this can also be paid to the school office.

MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS

Please ensure you come to the school office to fill out a medical form if your child requires medication during school hours. If your child needs to use an inhaler please ensure that they are brought to school, named and in a sealed plastic bag.

PEANUT FREE

At the present time we do not have any children enrolled with a Peanut Allergy, therefore we are going to allow peanut products e.g peanut butter in children's lunch boxes. If we receive notification about a peanut allergy we will need to re-instate our Peanut Free Policy.

RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION

Religious instruction for this year will begin on Tuesday, 21st February from 9.00 – 9.30 a.m. If you do not wish for your child to be involved in this please write a letter explaining this, addressed to the Principal and hand in to the school office prior to lessons beginning. Children that are not attending religious instruction will be supervised at school.

SWIMMING

It is an expectation that students will be swimming in their class time, unless there is a note/phone call received providing an explanation as to the reason for non-swimming. Please check with your child's classroom teacher for the swimming timetable because classes are not swimming on a daily basis, as per the swimming pool regulations.

MEET THE TEACHER

This is an opportunity for parents/caregivers to meet the staff/BOT/PTA, find out information about the school systems and classroom routines/expectations, and allows for teachers to answer any questions that they may have about their children's learning. Further information will follow.

GIFTED AND TALENTED

Parents are invited to check on the school website for access to our Gifted and Talented Parent questionnaire. If you don't have access to the website feel free to contact Mrs Hollingsworth or Mrs Kirkham for one. We encourage parents who feel their child is gifted or talented in any academic, social, cultural or sporting pursuit to complete this short questionnaire. The information from this provides our teaching staff with valuable insights about your children.

Our school defines gifted and talented students as "those learners who have the potential for outstanding performance (equivalent to 2 years and above their chronological age) and achievements in a wide range of areas."

By the end of Term 1 the teaching staff will have worked through the questionnaires from parents, alongside the teacher questionnaires and supporting school data to identify those students who will be included in our school G & T register. Teachers will then plan and implement learning programmes to support and extend these students. In many cases, this will take the form of providing differentiated/extension learning opportunities within the classroom. There may also be times where these students are able to access options for extension outside the classroom. We will also continue to give these students the opportunities to participate in external examinations such as ICAS and Science Technology Challenge, as we have done in the past. Parents will be contacted by letter for permission to be included in any additional programmes outside their regular class programme. If you require further information about the Gifted Talented programmes at Rotokauri School, do not hesitate to contact either Mrs Kirkham or Mrs Hollingsworth.

REMINDERS

CAR PARK

Thank you to the parents/caregivers that are currently using the bottom carpark as an alternative for picking up their child/children. This takes the pressure off the top carpark. The median strip on the road is not supposed to be used for parking in for long periods while waiting to enter the carpark. Therefore, we ask that all vehicles entering the bus bay zone promptly pick up children and then move off. It is not designed for parents/caregivers to park and leave your vehicle in the bus bay zone or for vehicles to block the traffic flow by waiting for a long period of time for your child/children to arrive. If your child is not in the bus bay zone please find a carpark and wait for them there.

A friendly reminder that the pedestrian crossings are to be used by all adults and children on the school grounds. There have been a number of incidences where parents/caregivers have ignored the pedestrian crossings and even after being reminded by staff and students continue to walk randomly across the carpark area. This is not acceptable and the students have noticed the lack of consideration shown for our school rules. It is always our aim to keep everyone SAFE whilst on our school property. Your attention to this would be appreciated – please ensure all adults picking up your child/children are made aware of the Carpark Rules on display.


