PRINCIPAL APPOINTMENT

The Rotokauri School Board of Trustees has been working with Richard Clarke, Education Consultant, on the appointment of our new Principal. The appointment process included a range of steps including consultation with stakeholder groups, applicant's self-assessment, referees' reports, phone referencing, visits by the committee to meet applicants in their current place of employment and a formal interview.

We would like to acknowledge and thank all members of our school community who took the opportunity to have input into this process. The Board considered a range of information in making its decision to appoint.

We are pleased to announce that over the past weekend the Board appointed Desiree Smith as the new Principal of Rotokauri School. As Desiree is moving from her current position of Acting Principal, she is immediately able to take up her appointment as Principal.

PTA NEWS

Welcome from the PTA to another year at Rotokauri School! We look forward to another year working with you.

A little bit about the PTA

PTA's have been helping the school community for at least 100 years in New Zealand. They are associations of parents and family based in the school, whose aim is to bring closer the relationship between the home and the school for the benefit of the children. The PTA provides services and raises funds for the benefit of the school and specific projects.

Rotokauri School has an active PTA. Currently there are 9 people on the Committee (teachers and parents) who attend meetings once a month.

- Regular PTA services provided to the school include:
- Lunch orders
- Discos
- Sunhats, T-shirts, goggles and swim caps
- Fundraising over the last couple of years has resulted in the following PTA contributions to the school:
- Beautification Project \$10,000
- Adventure Trail Phase One: \$10,000
- \$200 per year to each teacher for classroom equipment.
- Subsidies to the cost of speakers, class trips etc.
- Donation per child to school camp
- Large Gazebos x 4 for use at school events value approximately \$6400.
- ➤ So far this year (2017) the PTA has provided/ passed payment for:
- Funds to subsidise the Xtreme waste trip \$1,035.
- Funds for Gymnastics and movement equipment \$4,197.75
- New sandpit cover approximately \$1,200.
- \$200 to each teacher for classroom equipment \$1600.

Friends of the PTA

There is also a Friends of the PTA group. Being a friend of the PTA means that you don't have to commit to coming to all the meetings but you will be informed about what is going on & what we need help with. If it happens that you have the skills, time, contacts or resources you can simply let us know by email how you are able to help.

Fundraising 2017

Last year was a busy year with many fundraising activities (ten!). This year the PTA is trying a different approach – less fundraisers with bigger returns. We would like to try and raise a substantial amount of money at the start of the year to use over the course

of the year for the benefit of the students. So, we have only planned three fundraisers this year, two of which will be BIG!

The planned fundraisers are:

- 1) First Term: EASTER RAFFLE will be HUGE this year with BIG prizes including thousands of \$\$\$ in Travel vouchers, Hamilton Zoo Family year passes, shopping vouchers, Easter eggs treats for the whole family.
- 2) Second term: Entertainment books

Swimming Pool Vandalism

Please remember that if you see any signs of mistreatment/vandalism of our school property report it to the school promptly, with evidence if possible e.g photos of the culprits. Unfortunately last weekend (late Saturday evening/early Sunday morning) our pool volunteers arrived at the pool area to discover a large mess in the toilet area and a variety of objects in the pool itself – orange road cones, rubbish bins and toilet paper. This meant that the pool needed to be closed and a large amount of hours were spent cleaning out the filters and pump. At the moment we are unsure of whether the pool was entered by a key holder or not. This deeply saddens me as it shows a lack of respect for our school and is totally unnecessary. We would appreciate any information regarding this incident and would treat this with strict confidentiality.
